Remarks on board June 15th 1835. 4

At 5 A.M. got under sail and proceeded down
the river with N N W at 8 the wind changed to
to South. All hands employed in working
Ship beating out of the Bay all drawing Sail
16

So ends this day

Remarks on board Friday June 17th 1835.

First part strong breeze from the South and clear
employed in beating out of the Bay at 7 P.M.
discharged the Pilot at 8 P.M. wind changed to
to Southwest middle part strong breeze and haze
took one reef in the Topsails. At 11 P.M. tacked
Ship and stood by the wind S.W. At 12 Mide
night Gay-head Light bears E distant 12 miles
at 7 A.M. kept her off S.W. - Thus 24 hours end
with fine weather

Remarks on board Saturday June 18th 1835

Commences with light breeze from N.W. and
pleasant weather Middle part latter part light
breezes and hazy. All hands employed in
getting back to the Cove S.W.
