Remarks on board Sunday June 19<sup>th</sup> 1835

These 24 hours commence with light winds from the west and clear weather at 1 P.M. saw Black fish going quick to the west kept the Ship East. at 8 P.M. wind changed to S.W. Middle and latter part strong breeze at 1 A.M. took in Fore and Mizzen Top Gallant sails at 5 set Fore Top Gallant Sails At 8 A.M. saw a ship on the weather quarter steering to the Eastward.

So ends this day

Remarks on board Monday June 20<sup>th</sup> 1835

These 24 hours with strong breeze from S.W. and clear weather Middle light winds at West and thick weather at 7 P.M. furlled the Fore and Mizzen Top Gallant sails At 9 A.M. wind changed to East heaved up on the wind to S.S.E. employed in fitting Rigging. At 10 A.M. picked up a box of Hyem Tea found it entirely wet with salt water and worth nothing cast it overboard. These 24 hours end with light wind and thick weather

Remarks on board Tuesday June 21<sup>st</sup> 1835

Commence light winds from E and thick rainy weather at 1 P.M. tacked ship to the southward head up S.E. by E. At 2 P.M. strong breeze took two reefs in the Topsails at 4 P.M. moderate shook one reef from Fore Topsail Middle strong breeze and thick weather with lightning At 11 P.M. took in gibs and spanker and took a second reef in Fore Topsail at 3 A.M. wind changed to E.S.E. tacked to the Northward head up S.E. by S At 7 saw a Brig standing by the wind to the South

Remarks on board Wednesday June 22<sup>nd</sup> 1835

These 24 hours commence with strong wind and rain at 3 P.M. more moderate at 4 wind changed to S.W. made all sail and steered East - At 5 saw something we called a sperm whale lowered 2 Boats and found it to be a small vessel sunk level with the water Middle squally with rain and Sig'ring. at 10 P.M. took in Top Gallant Sails and jib Last part clear weather and strong breeze from S.W. at 3 A.M. made all sail

Remarks on board Thursday June 23<sup>rd</sup> 1835

Commence clear weather and strong breeze from S.W. at 1 P.M. took in Top Gallant Sails and took 2 reefs in the Topsails a 4 a Gale and squally took in all sail but then reefed the Topsail and Foremast staysails and luffed to the wind head up South at 5 tacked to S.W. wait Boat At 7 more moderate kept her off E by S and set Fore sail and double reefed Fore Topsail Middle squally with rain at 5 A.M. made sail latter part light winds from W.N.W. and clear weather So ends this 24 hours

Remarks on board Friday June 24<sup>th</sup> 1835

Commence light winds from W.N.W. and clear weather at 10 P.M. wind changed to S.W. and thick weather standing by the wind to the East at 7 P.M. took in Top Gallant Sails and put one reef in the Topsails Middle strong winds and thick weather at 2 P.M. took another reef in the Topsails at 10 set jib spanker and mainsails - Standing by the wind E.S.E. a Brig in sight to the South standing same way - So ends this 24 hours
