Wednesday Oct 21st 1857

At 10. A. M. got under weigh with a strong breeze from N. W. all hands employed Stowing Chairs and anchors at noon discharged the Pilot, found a man stowed away between decks

Thursday Oct 22^d

First part fresh Breezes and Clear Weather the Ship Steering S. by E. at 12 P. M. various Land bearing N. E. 30 miles, from off which we take our departure Middle & latter part Wind fresh & steady Steering S. E. all hands employed fitting Boats, found a man stowed away between decks that did not belong to the ship sent him forward to do duty as a Green hand

Lat at noon 37.03 N.

Friday Oct 23^d

This day fine weather & steady breeze from S. E. the Ship Steering S. E. all hands employed to work on rigging fitting Boats & Sunday Vobs saw something in the water that looked like the stump of a mast

Lat 37.20 N Long 66.30 W

Saturday Oct 24th

Came in with fine weather and moderate breeze from S. E. Steering S. E. middle and latter part Steering by the Wind heading to the Southward employed fitting Boats, breaking out and various other sets

Lat 36.49 N Long by Chron 66.00 W

Sunday Oct 25th

First part light Breezes and variable the Ship Standing to the Southward middle and latter part moderate Breeze from S. E. saw several vessels Steering to the S. W.

Lat 37.23 N Long 65.40 W

Monday Oct 26th

These twenty four hours fresh gales and heavy sea running, the Ship laying to on the Eastern tack, at 10 A. M. wore Ship to the Westward, latter part heading to the Eastward, under close reef main top sail, and reef foresail, saw a Brig Standing to the S. W.

Lat at noon 38.01 N
