Tuesday Oct 27th 1857

These twenty four hours fresh Gales from S.W. Laying to under Close reef Main topsail & Reef foresail bidding to the S.E. nothing in sight, one man sick
Observation

Wednesday Oct 28th

This day comes in with fresh Gales from S.W. Steering E.S.E. Middle and latter part squally and rainy Saw a vessel steering to the S.E. ends with fresh Gales turned the reef out of the Main topsail
Lat by obs. 37.13 N Long by Chron 46.28 W

Thursday Oct 29th

First part fresh Breezes and squally the Ship steering E.S.E. Middle and latter part fine Weather and good Whirlsail Breeze all hands employed setting up rigging. Saw nothing
Lat 36.45 N Long 57.16 W

Friday Oct 30th

All these twenty four hours fresh Breezes and squally Weather the Ship steering E.S.E. Saw nothing of importance the Watch employed about Ships duty three men slightly sick of the sea
Lat 36.25 N Long 53.17 W

Saturday Oct 31st

This day fine Weather and moderate breezes from the Westward steering E.S.E. Saw nothing of importance the Watch employed about Ships duty setting up rigging and various jobs ends with variable winds
Lat 36.20 N

Sunday November 1st

These twenty four hours employed tacking sails &c the Ship standing to the S.E. latter part saw a school of Blackfish lowered for them, the first boat struck and drawn, after Chasing a while took up the boats and stood away to the S.E. ends with fine Weather
Lat 35.42 N Long

Monday Nov 2^d

This day comes in with fresh Westerly Gales the Ship standing to the S.E. Middle part squally ends with better Weather saw a large Ship steering to the N.W.
Lat 35.02 N Long 47.37 W

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Tuesday Nov 3^d 1857

This day fine Weather and light Breezes the Ship steering to the E.S.E. Middle and latter part nearly Calm Employed tacking up spars and other small jobs. Saw porpoises, one man sick
Lat by obs 34.48 N Long by Chron 46.28 W

Wednesday Nov 4th

These twenty four hours fine Weather and moderate breezes from the Westward the Ship steering to the East South East saw porpoises and the small fry employed breaking out in the fore hold for water one man off duty sick
Lat by obs 34.23 N Long by Chron 43.52 W

Thursday Nov 5th

Comes in with fine Weather and moderate Breeze from S.W. the Ship steering S.E. by E. Middle and latter part much the same employed breaking out in the after hold, a vessel in sight steering to the S.E. one man off duty sick. Ends with fine Weather
Lat 34.10 N Long 40.20 W

Friday November 6th

This day comes in with fine weather and moderate breeze the Ship standing to the N.E. by E. Middle and latter part light and variable saw nothing. two men off duty sick, found the Main topsail yard slightly sprung.

Saturday November 7th

Comes in with moderate Breeze from N.W. the Bark steering S.E. by E. Middle part moderate latter part strong Breeze and squally Weather several vessels in sight standing by the Wind to the Eastward two men sick
Lat 32.37 N Long by Chron 34.55 W

Sunday Nov 8th

These twenty four hours fine Weather and moderate breeze from the Westward middle and latter part nearly Calm several vessels in sight standing to the Eastward. two men off duty sick. Saw porpoises. Ends the third Sunday from home
