

Bark. John. A. Robb of Fairhaven

Saturday Nov. 21<sup>st</sup> 1857

First part fresh trades the ship steering for Porto Praya at 3.30 P.M. lowered a Boat and put our letters on Board the Sloop of war St. Louis, the Bark Cecilia 1<sup>st</sup> lying in quarantine with the Captain and five men sick of African Fever buried 1 man this afternoon, middle and latter part fresh trades lowered the Boats for Blackfish without success

Lat 13.10 N Long 22.50 W

Sunday Nov 22<sup>nd</sup>

These twenty four hours fresh trades the ship steering S.E. middle and latter part nearly calm lowered for Blackfish and took 3 small ones

Monday Nov 23<sup>rd</sup>

East and middle part light winds and variable the ship steering to the S.E. middle and latter part much the same saw Grampuses and porpoises, ends with rainy weather, one man off Duty sick

Tuesday Nov 24<sup>th</sup>

Comes in with moderate breeze from N. the ship steering S by E. middle and latter part rain saw a ship steering to the Southward latter part lowered for Blackfish without success, one man sick

Wednesday Nov 25<sup>th</sup>

Comes in with fresh Breeze from North the ship steering South middle and latter part rainy saw nothing one man sick

Thursday Nov 26<sup>th</sup>

This day comes in with moderate trades the ship steering South middle and latter part fresh S.E. trades employed Peeling Blackfish Blubber finished about noon saw Blackfish

Friday Nov 27<sup>th</sup>

All these twenty four hours fine weather and moderate breezes from the Southward the ship steering S.W. saw several Whalesmen bound to the Northward employed getting rigging and other work one man off Duty sick

Lat 4.10 N Long 22.15 W

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Saturday Nov 28<sup>th</sup> 1857

These twenty four hours fine weather and moderate trades the ship steering by the wind to the Eastward saw several vessels employed on rigging, one man off Duty sick

Lat 3.20 N Long 22.40 W

Sunday Nov 29<sup>th</sup>

Comes in with fine weather and a good Whalesail breeze from South the ship steering by the wind to the Eastward at 10. P.M. hooked to N.E. saw two schools of Blackfish but did not lower

Lat 2.42 N Long 23.13 W

Monday Nov 30<sup>th</sup>

Fresh trades the ship steering to the N.E. saw several vessels bound Northward middle and latter part moderate saw Blackfish one man off Duty sick

Lat 1.24 N Long 25.18 W

Tuesday Dec 1<sup>st</sup> 1857

These twenty four hours fine weather and moderate trades the ship steering S.W. by W. saw plenty of Blackfish but did not stop for them so ends with good Whalesail Breeze

Lat 0.20 S Long by Chron 26.31 W

Wednesday Dec 2<sup>nd</sup>

This day comes in with fine weather and moderate trade winds the ship steering by the wind to the S.W. saw Blackfish but did not lower for them employed breaking out for Water in the Main Waterway

Lat 2.42 N Long 27.10 W

Thursday Dec 3<sup>rd</sup>

These twenty four hours fine trade winds the ship steering S.W. by the Wind saw nothing employed to work on rigging and Sundry jobs.

Lat 2.58 N Long 28.45 W

Friday Dec 4<sup>th</sup>

This day fine weather and strong trades the ship steering S.W. middle and latter part moderate saw a vessel steering to the N.E. employed to work on rigging so ends

Lat 6.46 S Long 30.12 W
