

Saturday April 20th 1867

Got underweigh from wharf at 8 A.M. The tug took us in tow, and came to anchor off Blacks Point. Got underweigh again at 10 A.M. with a strong breeze from S.W. The pilot left us off low and high light but at 3 P.M. Stowed the Deakies, and closed the watches, weather looking bad this evening

Sunday April 21st

Fine weather first part latter part commenced to breeze in. Shortened sail squally. Ship heading S.E.

Monday April 22nd

Had middlings good weather first part. Boarded the English Ship Cineter from Bon Bay bound to Boston. Got a Nautical Almanac (year 1867)

Tuesday April 23rd

This twenty four hours changeable weather with light and squally weather Engaged at various jobs
Lat 38° 47' N

Wednesday April 24th

First part fine weather with a strong breeze. Steering S by W Latter part fine weather. Had some sails going S

Thursday April 25th

All these 24 hours strong breeze. Ship under short sail heading S

Friday April 26th

Commences with fresh breeze. Heading S and S.W. Middle part E.N.E.
