 Fair, wind light from N.W. Course N. 30° E. Passed
 Long Island at 2:30 P.M. Chincobuck Light in sight
 this evening 10 miles distant. The wind died out a
 calm at 4 P.M. Block Island Lighthouse 51 miles
 distant this evening.

Thursday April 7th
 Fair, wind moderate from S.W. Block Island
 at 8 A.M. on our port beam. Took a pilot
 at 10 A.M. Capt. Weeks left for New Bedford
 in pilot boat at 11 A.M. wind light all night
 from S.W. Received 11:18 last night Montauk
 Light Sattyshook sight ahead. So ends voyage

Jan 15th 1875
 Weather fine, and a strong breeze from
 S.E. At 6:30 AM Mr. Dabney raised
 a schoony of sperm whales going about
 N.W. Lowered and starboard boat
 struck, and then larboard. Starboard
 had to cut line, being afraid of the
 larboard, but fastened to him again
 saved him and my line. The larboard
 parted her line and lost her ~~two~~ whale.

Lat N Long W

Monday Jan 25th 1875
 At 2 P.M. I raised a lone sperm whale
 going to the leeward, lowered both boats
 at 5 P.M. and I got, within 2 spoutings
 of him, when he went down, which was
 dark at the time, he would make 80 or 100
 Lat 10° 15' S Long 113° 00' W

Tuesday March 2nd
 Fine weather, and a good breeze from N.W.
 Our barometer has been down 28 for 2 or
 3 days, off Cape Horn today but did not
 sight the land
 Lat 57° 15' S Long 69° 43' W

Wednesday March 10th
 Fine weather, and good breeze from N.W.
 steering N.E. today we commenced to make
 the masthead, and saw a large number finbacks
 also a large iceberg and a small one
 and they are in Lat 47° 50' S Long 41° 10' W
