Remarks on Board Sunday 23rd June 1839
First part fresh breeze from west steering E by S at 6 P.M. it
came on equally just after ship under close reef main topsail before
sails steering E by S Middle strong gale from West steering E by S
at 12 More Mermaid set the fore topsail double reefed at 12 hook the reef
out of the main topsail at 2 made all sail thick foggy rainy weather
Latter part light winds from N.W. and variable weather nothing in sight
Lat by Obs 39 00 Long 46 38

Remarks on Board Monday 24th June 1839
First part light winds from N.W. steering E by S with
all sail cut saw 2 humpbacks Middle strong breeze from West
steering E by S latter part strong breeze from West steering
E by S at 7 double reefed topsails employed building jolatoc pen
and ships duty Lat by Obs 38 35 Long 57 54

Remarks on Board Tuesday 25th June 1839
First part light winds from S.W. and calm heading E by S
employed in fitting cutting gales &c nothing in sight at 6 lowered
the boats for the Cruetz they got there hands in Liddle light
and cloudy at 4 AM the wind hauled S.W. with a fine breeze
latter part Brisk breeze from N.W. and thick hazy weather
employed in ships duty &c Lat by Obs 38 50 Long 55 10

Remarks on Board Wednesday 26th June 1839
First part Brisk breeze N.W. steering East employed in fitting
whale gear & one sail in sight Middle strong breeze from
S.W. heading E by S with thick hazy weather latter part
light winds E by S heading S.E. one sail in sight hands
employed in ships duty &c Lat by Obs 38 42 Long 52 50

Remarks on Board Thursday 27th June 1839
First part light winds and calm from S.W. heading S.E.
hands employed in ships duty &c sail in sight Middle &
latter light air & calm at 10 AM lowered for a sperm whale
at 10 PM truck and kil got 2 boats stove on very bad and
one man hurt Lat by Obs 38 42

Remarks on Board Friday 28th June 1839
First light air & calm at 6 took the whale for the
ship just on the fluke chain took in sail &c &c in day
by the whale Middle and latter light air and calm 5 PM at 6
cutting fine pleasant weather one sail in sight
Lat by Obs 38 16 Long 52 17 by Chron
