

good weather the Capt intends going ashore and see if he
can not catch some small fish if there is any here and
he talks of shooting a Bear but I do not think there is much
danger of it it commenced raining and rained till twelve steady
and then it rained. ~~It rained about 1/2 hour and in good~~
breeze and shifted down around the Camp

Wednesday July 25th

Raised two Ships standing in towards land
he stood in to about 5 miles of land here that and stood
of the says it is to let to go this day hauled back down
ward they coming for us one proved to be the ship the other
the Chander Price both of it B the Chas 2200 lbs of 500 fath
top full sail and the job hauled up once stood of and on
land under you in a clear cabin I received their letters
from here by the way of Capt. Feber at day light moved 9
Boats and pulled in for the Bay it being a dead calm
he pulled till there was not a ship to be seen and then
was 5 miles from land and the Bay is 15 miles deep see two
Bears and the coast was covered with tracks

Thursday July 26th Lat 59.10

We have seen 5 Bla. Birds did not try to strike
them plenty of mice places to Anchor here and for any part
I think there might be Whales taken here though they can
not be seen 4 or 5 miles from land he started for the ship and
after putting 15 miles and having a head wind account just
see the ship it was a long time before the ship saw us he being
in shore so well get aboard after a haul of good 15 miles stand
along land all night covered four Boats at 6 o'clock

and stood in shore see one Bear head so stood along shore
with sail up a spanking breeze about eleven he see people
on the beach sent in there and landed see plenty of Whales
and Deer they were us salmon both dried and fresh
McDonald of us left hold

Friday July 27th

See a very few Bear tracks here although the people
told us there was plenty of them here yesterday the king
had died away in a great measure see any quantity of seal
they set traps from the ship he was to come on board pulled
on board heeled up got every thing ready for the snow
the Capt had made two sets one for it & the other for B. But
stood Boats Cross tracks saw one black all sail set
sailed all hands got breakfast and three Boats sent
in shore boats staying on board good breeze did not
pull any Capt had made sets for the Boats and he like
them so much did not see a spot sent on board they
had see two Whales and heard for them

Saturday July 28th

The Capt Panning with the C. Price the day
it met in sight steering full and by an adverse
tack wind from the Eastward came on board left
her of to 1/2 of square in space set Boats Cross tracks
2 hours each pulled 1/2 of square and drove to full sail brace in
hard core loose the top and down to full sail see quite a fresh
looking Tommie raised a sail on the western beam steering the same
course our Partner is close to us both ships get through the water
about the same rate this ship is turned well that one had
