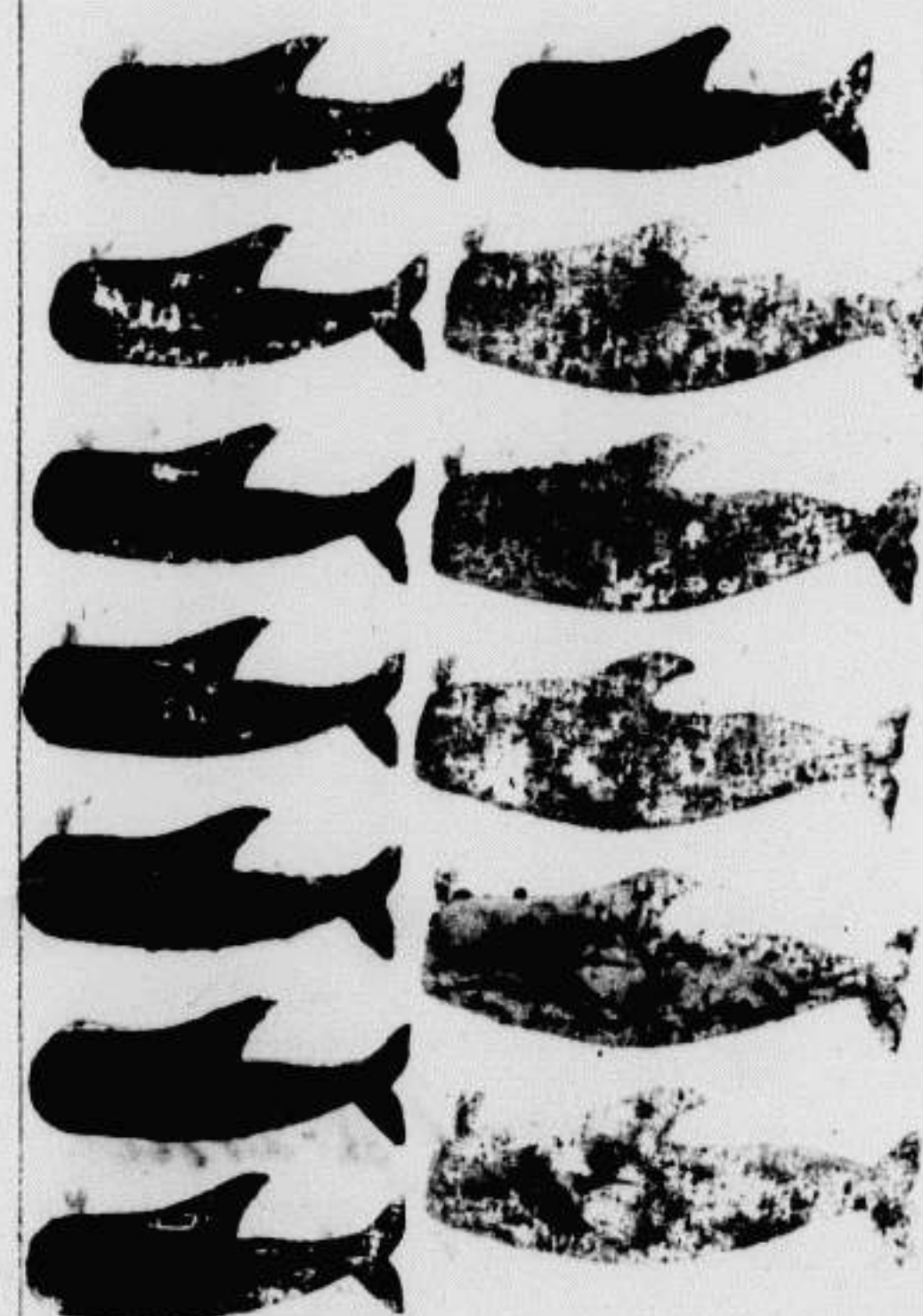

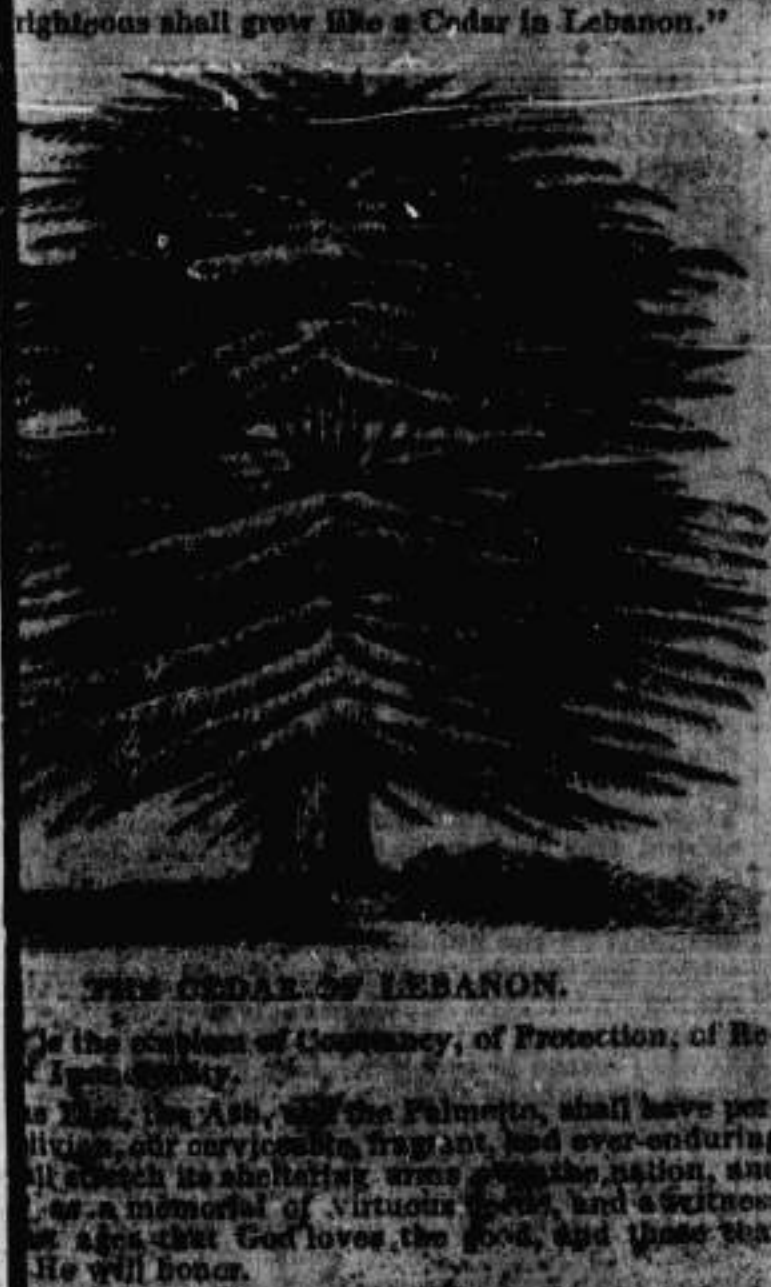


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VIEW OF THE ANNUAL FAIR OF THE NEW YORK STATE AGRICULTURAL SOCIETY.
