Remarks on board Tuesday April the 23rd 1861

Comment with fine breezes from north west and good weather set the jib, and middle stunsail the watch employed getting the boats ready for whaling latter part of the night made in strong abost reefed the topsail nothing going on with remainder latter part blowing a gail So ends

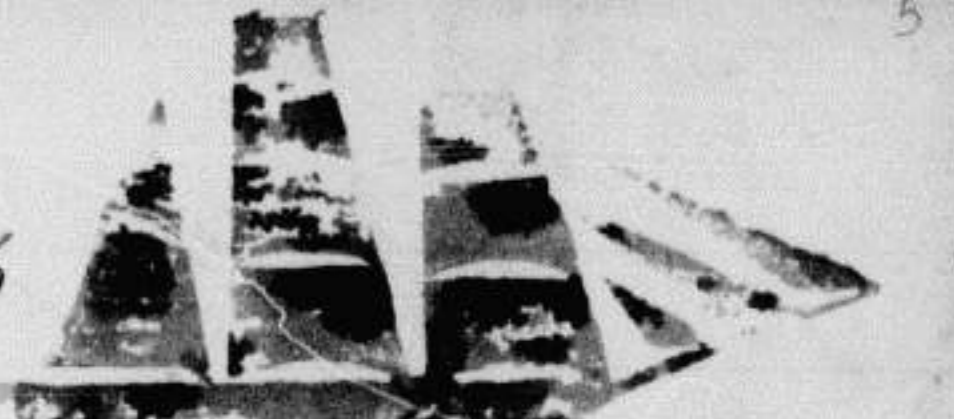
Remarks on board Wednesday April the 24th 1861

Comment with a gail from south west and a bad sea running at two o'clock P.M. took in the Pursail and topsail and here the brig two heading to the southward latter part of the night had it more moderate saw a barque steering east at daylight set the topsails and Pursail and set off south east to make out for water latter part fair weather So ends Latitude 30. 47 N Longitude 61. 47 W

Remarks on board Thursday April the 25th 1861

Comment with fine breezes from north west and fair weather the watch employed getting the boats ready and putting on shipping gear saw a Brig steering east under all sail at sundown set off east south east had it vary thru the night at daylight cleared off the watch employed in ordinary ships duty latter part fine breezes steering south east by east So ends Latitude 29. 26 N Longitude 59. 22 W

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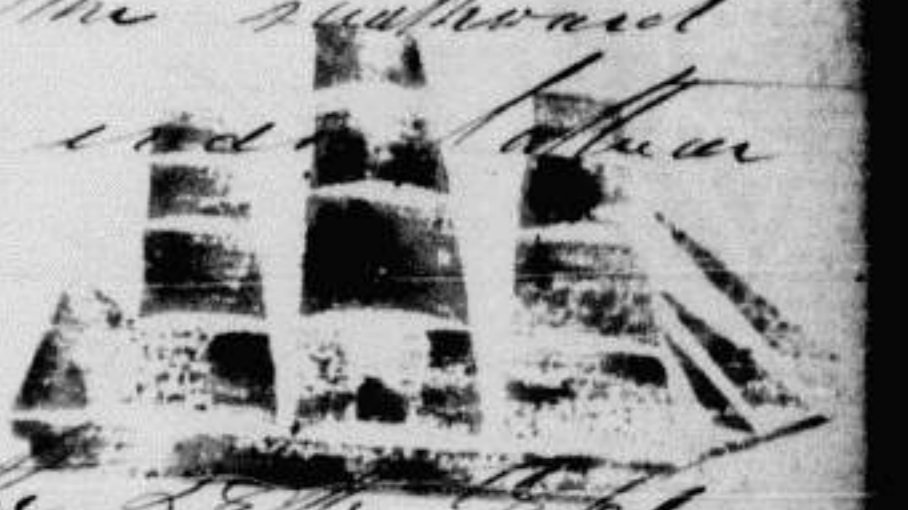


Remarks on board Friday April the 26th 1861

Comment with fresh breezes from north west and fair weather the watch employed in ordinary ships duty at four P.M. comment raining and blowing strong saw a sail steering north east at eleven P.M. cleared off So ends these twenty four hours Latitude 36. 31 N Longitude 56. 58 W

Remarks on board Saturday April the 27th 1861

Comment with strong breezes from north west and rugged weather saw humpbacks the watch employed in ordinary ships duty steering east south east had strong breezes thru the night at day light comment raining saw a ship steering to the southward at eleven P.M. cleared off So ends Latitude 36. 06 N Longitude 53. 58 W



Remarks on board Sunday April the 28th 1861

Comment with strong breezes from north west and rugged weather saw finbacks nothing going on with remainder at nine o'clock P.M. took in the four topsail blowing strong and raining and continued so all these twenty four hours at the four topsail singled reefed So ends no latitude

Remarks on board Monday April the 29th 1861

Comment with strong breezes from north west and rugged and rainy weather at four P.M. set the big main east by east still blowing heavy at seven P.M. took in the topsail and Pursail and here the brig two heading north west by west comment blowing on
