Day Clock and our boat steer of Duty  
Lat by Obs 37, 46<sup>N</sup> Long 68, 18<sup>W</sup>

Friday Oct 23, 1857  
Remarks on Board commences With strong  
Breezes and squalls Wind from the N<sup>W</sup> S<sup>E</sup> &  
middle part strong breezes from the N<sup>W</sup> bottom part  
strong breezes from the S<sup>E</sup> ship by the Wind to  
the S<sup>E</sup> all hands imployed in various jobs  
so ends this Day Clock the Duty known of Duty
