Sunday March 29th

This day fresh gale from NW
see opposite tacks. Saw 2 sails

Lat 36. 32 N
Long 69. 32 W

Monday Mar 30th

first part of this day has been
at some sail heading to the NW
middle squally and latter part severe
sail at 3 PM wind strong squalls from
NW; saw ship to the NW here too clear
at 1 PM

Lat 36. 15 N
Long 70. 35 W

Tuesday Mar 31st

This day begins a gale from NW &
and moderate gale squalls of hail
rain.

Lat 35. 50 N
Long 69. 57 W

Homeward Bound North Atlantic Ocean

Wednesday April 1st 1857

This day begins calm with light NW in forenoon
at 5 AM set set course 200 1/2
wind NW at 7 AM set set sail light wind one
sail in sight to the fresh breeze Lat 36. 30
compass a crack at 8 AM took in
light sails to the NW wind drew log 70. 10
some rain many squalls the night
fine wind clear 11 PM

Thursday April 2nd

a gale from NW lying to the
NW under close reef the 9 AM at 8 set 3/4
Saw 2 ships steering S & E considerable
sea on some hail only little rain cold
for 4 PM
