From the first of April until the

or to sea

and you will find plenty of whales
from May to Sept from Coffin's bay
to in counter bay where ever you find
shelter in the vicinity of the two
gulfs where ever you find shelter
from the prevailing winds in winter
months Prevailing winds in
in this sea from N.W. to S.W.

Trade at this place
Shoes and a few boots
Cotton cloth of good quality white
and Brown silk and wine Rum
and brandy and Axes Stamp glass
good Calico Ladies fine shoes
Sewing cotton

Hand Spikes oars spruce poles

Account of Black Whales Lat from 31. to 31.30 S
Long 173. to 174. W. in from Sept 25. to Oct 10th
By Capt. Masbuth of Ship Dartmouth

Account of Whaling ground by Capt
Fisher from Lat 42. to 45. Long 148. to 150 W
Saw plenty of Sperm whales and Black
whales in May & June but foggy
July & Aug & Sept is clear weather

A situation of a Rock by Capt Barney
Arook C.V.B. from French rock 41 miles
distance even with the water stage
Last of August and Sept Lat from 28.40 to 30.15
from Sunday distance to 60. miles E
got 200 bbls of whale oil

Account of Whaling by Capt Chase of Ship
George Long 176.00 E. Lat 45.40. to 46. S
In Dec Jan Feb & March & April & May
Capt Russell ground saw a
plenty of B. Whales in Lat 45.00
Long 150.00 W. Long. barrow home
Last of Dec and Jan
Port cargo for recruits Keep close
on board of the Rocks bound in to port
