

Remarks on Board Saturday February 13 1841

This 24 hours commences with strong winds from the NWW heaving A under double reef topsails & courses made fast strong winds and squally weather at 10 PM we shot and fired to the Southward & Westward until 3 o'clock then we ran and heaved A at day light struck our way out of the top sails & set the gill ends with strong breezes from the Westward

Sat 51-33 S

Remarks on Board Sunday February 14 1841

This 24 hours commences with brisk breezes from the Westward heaving NWW broke out for flour & sugar made fast strong gails at 11 o'clock reefed the top sails furl'd the main sail & mizen top sail & set later part strong gails from the West

Sat 49-26 S

Remarks on Board Monday February 15 1841

This 24 hours commences with strong gails from the Westward reefed the fore sail and set it made fast Brisk breezes set fore & mizen top sail & main sail at 2 o'clock set gill & spanker at day light main all sail crew with gentle breezes and blowway rather coarse NWW

Sat 47-34 S

Remarks on Board Tuesday February 16 1841

This 24 hours commences with moderate breezes from the Westward coarse NWW made fast later part Brisk breezes but the craft in too the boats and broke out the sail room and so ends this 24 hours

Sat 45-00 S

Remarks on Board Wednesday February 17 1841

This 24 hours commences with light winds from the Westward coarse NWW from 3 AM to 10 PM Calm took light breeze from the NWW cloudy weather & sun rain made fast the same later part moderate winds from the NWW heaving A and ends with moderate winds sun billows & few birds

Remarks on Board Thursday February 18 1841

This 24 hours commences with moderate winds from the NWW heaving A crew employ'd fitting her ropes in hopes for to have good for the end made fast strong breezes made reefed the top sails at 10 PM reefed reef & furl'd the main sail at 11 o'clock set main sail gill & spanker heaving A no observation

Remarks on Board Friday February 19 1841

This 24 hours commences with moderate winds from NWW and with a heavy sea & blowing weather at 4 PM main all sail at 6 o'clock heaving her course NWW made fast later part the same crew employ'd at fitting her ropes sent up the bettering seams with fine weather

Sat 40-24 S

Remarks on Board Saturday February 20 1841

This 24 hours commences with light winds from the SSW coarse NWW made fast later part Brisk breezes and sun rain spoke the ship N.C. Talmaage of Sociscey in want out no oil all well but lost a quantity of Cape Horn out of the Chances and so ends this 24 hours

Sat 38-55 S

Remarks on Board Sunday February 21 1841

This 24 hours commences with Brisk breezes from the South coarse NWW in company with the N.C. Talmaage made fast later part the same crew sail in sight and so ends this 24 hours

Sat 36

Remarks on Board Monday February 22 1841

This 24 hours commences with light winds from the SSW & South coarse NWW spoke the ship N.C. Talmaage of Sociscey Capt. Coppin in want out had one bag of rice made fast later part light winds all hands employ'd fitting boats and raising up spars got up the fore and other masts and so ends this 24 hours

Sat 34-21 S

Remarks on Board Tuesday February 23 1841

This 24 hours commences with moderate winds from the Southward coarse NWW the island of Sakaparra near Buriny N.B. distance 6 leagues all hands employ'd getting ready for rebuilding masts & later part Brisk breezes at day light made sail and steered to the NW Westward spoke the Barque Esmeralda of Peru Comd Capt. Finney with 450 bbls of oil 16 masts out and so ends this 24 hours

Sat 32-51 S

Remarks on Board Wednesday February 24 1841

This 24 hours commences with Brisk breezes from the SSW sun breezes at 11 o'clock & saw one porpoise made fast later part light winds & good weather crew employ'd making Springa Thirtie one boat and so ends this 24 hours

Sat 31-01 S
