these 24 hours commences with light airs from  
the SSE at 3 Pm raised blackfish land snails  
and birds & saved 5 hoisted them in more ship  
and laid 6, amongst cleaning & was the black  
fish mill & later part light airs and fine  
weather  
Lat 52 11 N

Remarks on board Friday January 25<sup>th</sup> 1844  
these 24 hours commences with light airs from the  
SSE steering SE the watch employ boiling  
black, black fish oil, finished boiling at 6 Pm  
mill & later part light airs  
Lat

Remarks on board Friday January 26<sup>th</sup> 1844  
these 24 hours commences with light airs from  
all parts of the compass with light squalls of  
rain mill & later part the same saw porpoises  
Lat 42 22 N

Remarks on board Saturday January 27<sup>th</sup> 1844  
these 24 hours commences with light winds from  
the SSE having SE mill & later part plenty  
of rain with variable winds  
Lat 32 44 N

Remarks on board Sunday January 28<sup>th</sup> 1844  
these 24 hours commences with light winds from  
the SSE and plenty of rain having SE  
mill & later part baffling wind and some rain  
Lat 32 11 N

Remarks on board Monday January 29<sup>th</sup> 1844  
these 24 hours commences with baffling winds and  
some rain at 3 Pm heavy squalls from ESE  
took in the light sails mill part merrit set  
the light sails having SE & later part merrit  
winds and fine weather the watch employ mauling  
& saw fore road  
Lat 22 44 N

Remarks on board Tuesday January 30<sup>th</sup> 1844  
these 24 hours commences with brisk winds from  
the SE at 4 Pm were ship and laid SSE  
mill part squally took in top galeant sails  
& fly jib merrit at 1 Pm merrit winds set  
light sails later part light winds and fine weather  
Lat 22 25 N

Remarks on board Tuesday January 31<sup>th</sup> 1844  
these 24 hours commences with light winds from the  
SE having ESE with light squalls of rain  
mill & later part the same the watch employ at ships  
factory  
Lat 22 13 N

Remarks on board Thursday February 1<sup>st</sup> 1844  
these 24 hours commences with baffling winds from the  
SE to SSE at 6 Pm were ship and laid ESE  
took in the top galeant sails and fly jib mill  
part light winds set the top galeant sails later part light  
winds and plenty of rain No observation  
Lat

Remarks on board Friday February 2<sup>nd</sup> 1844  
these 24 hours commences with light winds from the  
ESE and plenty of rain having SE SSE were ship  
at 4 Pm were ship and laid ESE mill & later part  
merrit wind and fine weather  
Lat 22 03 N

Remarks on board Saturday February 3<sup>rd</sup> 1844  
these 24 hours commences with light winds from  
ESE having E mill & later part merrit winds  
from the S the watch employ at ships factory  
Lat 12 44 N

Remarks on board Sunday February 4<sup>th</sup> 1844  
these 24 hours commences with merrit winds from  
the S having SE mill & later part light winds  
and fine weather saw porpoises & finbacks  
Lat 12 40 N

Remarks on board Monday February 5<sup>th</sup> 1844  
these 24 hours commences with light winds from  
SSE having E with fine weather mill & later  
part baffling winds from all part of the compass  
on board the fore sail and merrit it  
Lat 12 45 N

Remarks on board Tuesday February 6<sup>th</sup> 1844  
these 24 hours commences with baffling wind and some  
rain but the fore sail & mill & later part  
light winds from the S having SE  
Lat 12 33 N
