Commencs Calm 3 Sails in
sight. Spoke the steamer of
Philadelphia got her news all
well bound to Martinique got
the news of President Garfield being
shot. Ends Calm.

from S.E. Course N.W. & N. Tones the
same

from S.W. at 3 Squally with heavy
rain. Middle Squally with heavy
rain tones fine from N.W. all
sail by the wind to the N. Employed
at various jobs setting up Job
Salant Ripping etc.

Commences with light air from
W.S.W. all sail to the N. Saw one sail
tones with thick Squally weather
from S to W.S.W. Course N.W. & N.
