

Remarks On Board Bark Lancer Of

Saturday Aug 20th 1891
Commenced with thick rainy
weather from S to N.W. Course
N.E.W. ends with fresh breeze and
squalls from S.W. by W.S.W. Course
N.E.W. double reefed Top Sails
Lat 35.43 N
Long 69.04 W

Sunday Aug 21st
Commenced with a Thunder Storm
from the Westward shut sail at 4
toke up some set main Top sail
ends with ad fresh Gale and roused
from W to N.E.W. with rain squalls
double reefed Top Sails to the Westward
Lat 37.22 N
Long 69.47 W

Monday Aug 22nd
Commenced with strong breeze from
N.W. heading to N and N.E. by S. Top
Sails saw 2 sails ends with Calms
and light airs from S.W. to S.E.
Course N.W. by N all sail
Lat 38.46 N
Long 70.08 W

Tuesday Aug 23rd
Commenced with light baffling and
Calms saw one sail ends the same
light baffling airs and Calms saw
7 sails all bound to the Eastward
but one
Lat 39.09 N
Long 70.20 W

Wednesday Aug 24th 1891
Commenced with Calms and light
airs from N.E.W. spoke the 9th in name
of Seaspit - 3 Days from N York for
Monterey Middle the same ends
with light-airs from N to N.E.W. from
6 to 12 sail in sight

Long

Thursday Aug 25th
Commenced with light breeze and
fine weather from N by the wind on
opposite Tacks at 2 to the Westward
wind to N.E. by the wind to N.W.
at 4 strong breezes and heavy
Middle moderating down to light
airs from N.E. to N.E. by S. Course
N.E.W. all sail ends light airs and
Calms cleared out the boat with other
jobs
Lat 40.32 N
Long 71.46 W

Friday Aug 26th
Commenced Calms and light-airs
from S.E. to S got the Anchor off the
bow at dusk saw the land bearing
N.W. at dusk at 7.30 saw 2 lights
bearing N.W. and N.E. by S. Course
at 3 N.E. by S ends light-airs from the
Southward and Westward Steady in for
the land from N.E. by S fine weather

Saturday Aug 27th
Fine weather from the Southward at 1 o'clock
took a Pilot at 4.30 dropped Anchor
Dressed the sails left the ship all right -
this ends the voyage of Bark Lancer
