Remarks On Board The

Tuesday 19<sup>th</sup> of September 1837 In the South Atlantic the first & middle part fine breezes & pleasant weather from the south later part squally & some rain Ends with fine breezes from the S.S.E. & passing Clouds all sail set to good advantage a net nothing seen from the masthead these 24 hours  
Latitude by Obs - 1° 12' 0"  
Longitude at 8 P.M. by Chron 16° 56' 4"

Wednesday 20<sup>th</sup> All these 24 hours lively breezes from the S.S.E. & pleasant weather with passing Clouds all sail set to the best advantage all hands well & in good spirits  
Latitude by Obs 2° 56'  
Longitude at 8 past meridian 18° 44'

Thursday 21<sup>st</sup> All these 24 hours lively breezes from the S.S.E. & pleasant weather larboard tacks aboard & all sail set to the best advantage Saw a considerable number of boats shot two  
Latitude by Obs 4° 53'  
Longitude at 8 P.M. 19° 15'

Friday 22<sup>nd</sup> All these 24 hours lively breezes from the S.S.E. & passing Clouds all sail set to good advantage nothing seen these 24 hours from the masthead  
Latitude 6° 58'  
Longitude at 8 A.M. by Chron 20° 16'  
by Lunar 21° 15'

Saturday 23<sup>rd</sup> the first part of these 24 hours fine breezes & some cloudy middle part strong breezes & some squally took in 2 g. sails later part lively breezes from S.E. to S.S.E. & pleasant weather all sail set to the best advantage  
at 6 A.M. saw a sail of our weather bow on the same sta. & which proved to be a barque we past her at 12 meridian she bore 3 points ahead our beam  
Latitude by Obs 8° 47'  
Longitude at 8 P.M. past 21° 12'

Sunday 24<sup>th</sup> P.M. Commences with fine breezes from the S.S.E. & fine weather middle part some squally & light rain later part strong breezes & pleasant weather all sail set to the best advantage  
Latitude by Obs 10° 41'  
Longitude at 9 A.M. by lunar 22° 56'

In The South Atlantic Ocean Bound on the

Whaling ground in the latitude 35 & long 22 of St. A. Stewart  
the first & middle part of these 24 hours fine breezes from S.S.E. to S.E. later part strong breezes from S.E. & good weather  
Latitude 12° 28' 0"  
Longitude at 3° 30' past meridian 22° 57' 4"

Monday 25<sup>th</sup> All these 24 hours lively breezes from the S.E. 1<sup>st</sup> part later from the East Clear & pleasant weather 1<sup>st</sup> part Course S.S.W. later part S.W. All sail set to the best advantage nothing seen these 24 hours  
Latitude 15° 05'  
Longitude at 2.30 past meridian 23° 22'

Tuesday 26<sup>th</sup> P.M. Commences with fine breezes from the S.S.E. & pleasant middle & later part light breezes from the S.E. & Clear weather the watch employed in ships duty  
Longitude at 5 past meridian 25° 57'

Wednesday 27<sup>th</sup> All these 24 hours light breezes from the S.E. & Calms Clear & warm weather Course Stead S.W. by W.  
Latitude by Obs 16° 48' 00"

Thursday 28<sup>th</sup> the first & middle part of these 24 hours light breezes from the S.E. later part lively breezes from the North & fine weather All sail set to the best advantage Course S.W. by W. another 24 hours past & nothing seen all hands well on board the watch employed in ships duty  
Latitude 18° 04'

Friday 29<sup>th</sup> Longitude at 230 past meridian 25° 42' 30"

Saturday 30<sup>th</sup> the first & middle part of these 24 hours strong breezes from the S.W. & good weather middle part Clouds would rise from the S.W. in 20 minutes from the time first visible above the horizon the hole horizon would be completely Clouded in & in a few minutes would settle away to the windward & the stars with splendour would shine for 15 or 20 minutes & then would be hid by a nother over East from the S.W. & so on from 12 middle part until 9 A.M. then the wind halled to the S.W. moderately these 24 hours Ends with light breezes from the West & good weather  
Latitude 20° 27' Longitude at 2 past meridian 26° 17'
