

Remarks on Board the Brig Leonidas

Sunday May the 9th 1841

Commences with strong Gale from the N. N. E. thick weather steering S. S. W. with a heavy sea passed a Brig laying to middle part more moderate made all sail clear weather latter part wind from the N. W. light words several sail in sight saw 1 Blackfish

Latt. By Obs. 37° 46' N. Long 72° 30' West

Monday May 10th Begins with light winds and moderate weather steering S. S. W. at 8 P.M. squally Reef the top sails at 2 A.M. took in the fore sail and fore top sail and fore Reef the main top sail and hove to heavy squalls of wind and Rain from southward heading to the westward at 8 A.M. wore to the S. E. thick cloudy weather so Ends

No Observation this Day

Tuesday May 11th This 24 hours commences with squalls of wind and plenty of Rain thick cloudy from the S. W. heading to the S. E. middle part the same at 5 A.M. set the fore and fore top sail passed 3 sail Employed filling the Boats and various other jobs so Ends started 1 Barrel of Beef and Black

Latt. By Obs. 37° 23' N. Long 72° 39' West

Wednesday May 12th Begins with fresh breezes from the westward and cloudy weather standing to the south at 1 P.M. made more sail middle part to the S. W. latter part the same at 10 A.M. squally took in the top Gallant sails and main sail and jib Double Reef the top sails so Ends

Latt. By Obs. 36° 31' N. Long 73° 11' W.

Thursday May 13th 1841 Begins with strong winds from the westward and squally weather at 2 P.M. took in the fore sail and fore top sail and close Reef the main Top sail and hove to middle part the same at 6 A.M. set the top sails Employed filling the Boats and various other jobs so Ends

No Observation

Friday May 14th Commences with strong winds from the westward and squalls of wind and Rain standing to the S. W. at 4 P.M. steer W. N. W. wind from the Northward middle calm and squalls of wind and Rain latter part the same so Ends

No Observation

Saturday May the 15th Begins with Cloudy thick and squally weather standing to the westward wind variable from N. N. W. to N. E. middle part shortened sail at day light made sail and steered W. S. W. latter part S. W. S. started 1 Barrel of Pork so Ends

Latt. By Obs. 35° 10' N. Long 74° 00' West

Sunday May the 16th Commences with fresh Breezes from the N. E. fine weather steering S. W. by S. middle and latter part the same 2 sail passed us so Ends

Latt. By Obs. 33° 12' N. Long 76° 18' West

Monday May the 17th Begins with fresh Breezes from the E. N. E. and Pleasant weather steering S. N. by S middle part the same latter part light breezes from the Eastward 2 sail in sight Employed filling Boats and various other jobs so Ends

Latt. By Obs. 31° 55' N. Long 76° 55'
