Monday April the 2nd 1842 Commences with fresh Breezes from the Eastward standing to the S.E. and S.E. wind variable at 2 A.M. wore to the N.E. latter part N.N.E. so Ends one man sick

Tuesday April the 3rd Begins with fresh Breezes from the Eastward variable standing N.N.E. at 6 P.M. squally close Reef the top sails and parted the fore sail middle and latter part the same so Ends one man sick

Lat By Obs. 25.39 N Long. 85.36 W

Wednesday April the 4th Commences with strong Gales from the Eastward standing to the N.N.E. at 4 P.M. let a Reef out of the top sails and set the Topy sail wore to the S.E. middle part the same at 6 A.M. set the M. sail and jib so Ends

Thursday April the 5th Begins with strong winds from the Eastward standing to the S.E. middle part to the S.E. at 8 A.M. wore to the N.E. so Ends one man sick

Friday April the 6th Commences with strong winds from the Eastward standing N.E. middle part the same at 7 A.M. tacked to the S.E. so Ends one man sick

Saturday April the 7th Begins with fresh Breezes from the Eastward standing S.E. middle part the same latter part more moderate at 10 A.M. made the Island of Cuba made sail heading E.S.E. so Ends one man sick

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Sunday April the 8th 1842 Commences with light winds from the N.E. standing E.S.E. in for the Island of Cuba at 1 P.M. tacked to the N.N.W. wind variable at 2 P.M. tacked to the E.S.E. at 4 P.M. tacked to the Northward 3 sail in sight so Ends

Lat By Obs. 23.42 N Long. 83.19 W

Monday April the 9th Begins with light winds and variable from East to North standing to the North at 1 P.M. tacked to the Eastward middle part E.S.E. at day light saw Cuba bearing S. moderate one sail in sight so Ends at 10 P.M. a steam Boat passed us steering to the N.W. so Ends

Tuesday April the 10th Comm. with light winds and moderate weather standing to the E.S.E. at 1 P.M. wore to the N.N.W. at 2 P.M. wore to the N.E. middle part fresh Breezes and variable at 7 A.M. tacked to the N.N.W. wind N.E. at 12 M. saw the Florida Reef so Ends one man sick started 1 Bl. of Beef 1 lb. of Flour

Lat By Obs. 25.11 N Long 79.50 W

Wednesday April the 11th Begins with fresh Breezes from N.E. hazy and variable standing N.N.W. at 1 P.M. tacked to the E.S.E. at 6 P.M. tacked to the N.N.W. at 10 P.M. tacked to the S.E. at 6 P.M. tacked to the N.N.W. so Ends the Florida the land in sight

Thursday April the 12th Commences with light Breezing winds from E.N.E. to N.N.E. standing to the N.N.W. at 1 P.M. tacked to the S.E. at 6 P.M. tacked to the Northward at 1 A.M. tacked to the Southward at 4 A.M. tacked to the Northward several sail in sight so Ends one man sick
