Tuesday April the 13th 1842 Commences with light winds from the Eastward variable standing to the N. N. E middle and latter part N. E and East so E do 40 mil in sight

Lat By Obs. 28. 27 N Long 78. 27 W

Thursday April the 14th Begins with light winds from the S. W. variable standing to the E. N. E at 5 P. M. saw whales and lowered going Quick to Windward we did not get on at sun set shortened sail heading E. wind from the South so Ends one man sick at day light made sail at 7 A. M. wore ship to the westward so Ends one man sick

Lat By Obs. 29. 03 N Long 77. 40 W

Friday April 15th Comm. with fresh Breezes from the South veered to the westward equally wore ship to the S. E at ~~sun set~~ shortened sail at day light made sail and wore ship Employed Repairing the Fore sail so Ends

started 1. Bbl of Pork

Saturday April the 16th Begins with fresh Breezes from the Westward variable standing to the Southward at set wore ship and shortened middle part equally with thunder and lightning wind all Round the Compass at day light made sail standing to the W. S. W. Employed mending the main sail finished the fore sail bent it for a main sail so Ends one man sick

Sunday April the 17th 1842. Commences with fresh breeze from the Southward standing to the W. S. W. at set shortened and wore to the Eastward middle and latter part strong Gales and heavy squalls with thunder and lightning a Brig passed steering to the N. E so Ends one man sick Closed up the M. T. sail and spencer square
No Observation

Monday April the 18th Begins with strong Gales from South to West laying to heading to the Eastward at 10 A. M. set the main top sail and spencer middle part the same at 10 A. M. wore ship to the S. E so Ends
No Observation

Tuesday April the 19th Commences with strong Gales and squally weather laying to heading to the S. E. Broke off W. N. W. wore to the Eastward wind variable middle part Thunder and lightning latter part heading to the N. W. so Ends

Lat By Obs. 29. 44 N Long 76. 48 W

Wednesday April the 20th Begins with strong Gales and variable squally weather wind from South to West laying to under close Reef Main top sail heading from N. N. W. to W. S. W. middle part the same at 8 A. M. set the fore sail and close Reef Fore top sail steering N. E so Ends one man sick

Lat By Obs. 30. 37 N Long 76. 23 W

Thursday April the 21st Comm. with strong Gales from the S. W. steering N. N. E. at sun set fueled the Fore sail and F. T. sail and wore to the N. W. middle part equally at day light wore ship steering N. E made sail Broke off N. W. wind variable started 1 Barrel of Beef so Ends one man sick

Lat By Obs. 31. 13 N Long 75. 51 W

Friday April the 22nd Begins with fresh Breezes and squally variable wind and weather standing to the Eastward at sun set shortened sail and wore to the N. E. equally at 7 A. M. set the Fore sail and F. T. sail and wore to the N. W. latter part N. N. W. wind from the Northward so Ends

Lat By Obs. 31. 34 N Long 75. 48 W
