Friday April the 23<sup>rd</sup> 1842 Commences with strong winds from the North and squally weather standing to the N. N. W. at sun set shortened sail bore to heading to the N. S. W. at 12 A.M. wore ship to the North at day light made sail steering North wind from the westward 2 sail in sight one man sick so Ends

Lat By Obs. 32. 11 N. Long. 75. 48 W.

Saturday April the 24<sup>th</sup> Begins with fresh Breezes from the westward and clear weather steering N. by E middle part N. N. E moderate latter wind S. E steering N. N. E one sail in sight so Ends one man sick

Lat By Obs. 33. 42 N. Long 74. 57 W

Sunday April the 25<sup>th</sup> Commences with light winds from the S. E steering N. N. E. at 4 P.M. N. E middle part the at 5 A.M. steered North latter N. N. W. several sail in sight wind N. S. W. so Ends one man sick

Lat By Obs. 35. 33 N Long 74. 00 W

Tuesday April the 26<sup>th</sup> Begins with fresh Breezes from the N. S. W. steering N. N. W. at 2 P.M. sheered at sun set bore to under close Reef main top sail strong winds from S. W. heading to the S. E middle part the same at 9 A.M. wore to the N. W. at 12. M wore to S. E so Ends

Wednesday April 27<sup>th</sup> Comm. with strong Gale from S. W. and Bad sea lying to heading to the S. E. middle part squally wind variable from N. S. W. to N. W. at 9 A.M. wore to the N. N. E set the Fore sail and Fore T. sail so Ends one man sick

Thursday April the 28<sup>th</sup> Commences with strong winds from the N. N. W. steering N. N. W. at sun set shortened sail bore to heading to the N. S. W. at 12 A.M. wore ship to the North at day light made sail steering North wind from the westward 2 sail in sight one man sick so Ends

Lat By Obs. 38. 03 N. Long 70. 03 W

Friday April the 29<sup>th</sup> Commences with strong winds from the westward steering N. N. W. at 12 P.M. made sail in the fore and main top sail and fore top sail bore to heading N. N. W. middle part the same at 7 A.M. wore to the S. W. set the S. T. sail so Ends one man sick

Lat By Obs. 38. 52 N. Long 70. 33 W

Saturday April the 30<sup>th</sup> Commences with strong Gale from the Westward standing to the S. W. at 1 P.M. wore to the North and N. N. W. squally at 3 P.M. set the fore top sail and fore top sail middle part the same at 7 A.M. wore to the S. W. set the S. T. sail so Ends one man sick

Lat By Obs. 39. 35 N. Long 71. 00 W

Sunday May the 1<sup>st</sup> Begins with light winds from the S. E. steering N. N. W. middle part the same at 9 P.M. sounded in 25 fathoms steering N. N. W. 2 sail in sight so Ends

Lat By Obs. 40. 11 N Long 71. 00 W

Monday May the 2<sup>nd</sup> Commences with light winds from the S. E. clear weather steering N. N. W. fresh Breezes from the S. E. weather thunders and lightning came over the ship at 7 P.M. sounded in 25 fathoms bore to heading the westward to thick and squally to Bore at 8 P.M. steered off North and made sail at 10 P.M. sailing steering N. N. W. at 1 P.M. made 11 black Tails at 1 P.M. passed point Judah
