lowered, and boarded her, found some old junk, and staves
she was a American, brig could not tell her name,

Monday 17th fine weather, strong winds from the S.W. steering
N.E. 3 sails in sight, saw wrecked brig belong to
Camden

Tuesday 18th fine weather, light winds from the S.W. steering
N.E. by N. the watch employed on ships duty

Wednesday 19th fine weather, light winds from the West
close, hauled to the N.E. East on sail in sight caught some Albicore

Thursday 20th fine weather, strong winds from the West steering
to the East, employed in fitting rigging saw some fish, bucket

Friday 21th fine weather, strong winds from the West working to
the East, lowered for black fish, but with out success variously
employed on sail, sight

Saturday 22th fine weather, light winds from the West steering
S.W. saw humpbacks and finbacks, sundown took in sail
and, closed to the wind

Sunday 23th fine weather, strong winds from the West, lay in
under easy sail, nothing doing on sail in sight

Monday 24th fine weather, light airs from the West steering
to the South, latter part calm, variously employed

Tuesday 25th fine weather, light winds from the S.W. steering
N.E. by N. 3 P.M. saw a carcass employed on the rigging

Wednesday 26th strong breeze from the S.W. steering N.E. by
S. under short sail

Thursday 27th strong breeze from S.W. steering to
the Northward & Eastward

Friday 28th first & middle strong breezes
from S.W. steering N.E. latter spoke the bark Atlantic
cap Sherman 200 sp 14 months out latter steering N.E.

Saturday 29th fine weather & fine breezes from
the westward spoke the Bark John Dawson
cap Cornell 23 months out 950 sp

Sunday 30th light breezes from the N.
steering to the Eastward under short sail

Monday July the 1st light breezes from the
heading to the East employed in setting up
rigging 4 sails in sight

Tuesday July the 2nd All these 24 hours light
airs from the S.W. steering to the East employed in
setting up rigging

Wednesday July the 3rd strong breezes from
the southward steering to the East spoke the
ship Benj Tucker & Bark Ocean of Sandwich

Thursday July the 4th fine weather & light airs from
the N. heading to W. in Co. with the Ocean

Friday July the 5th these 24 hours light airs from
N. heading to one sail in sight

Saturday July the 6th light airs from the N.
heading to the East 5 sails in sight set up the
fore fore Rigging
