



Saturday June 12<sup>th</sup> 1841  
Commences with light winds from the North  
at 1 pm hoist up anchor at 3 the die away  
and come into the South Middle light from  
the South Lateral much the same laying  
at anchor of Warwick Neck so ends

Sunday 13<sup>th</sup> 1841  
Wind from the South laying at anchor at  
Warwick Neck wind bound went on  
shore hired a cargo and went up to  
Providence after the Chronometer they but  
found that it periment on the Chronometer,  
Middle Light standing quarter  
watched Lateral the same period.

Monday 14<sup>th</sup> 1841  
Wind from the South laying at anchor  
of Warwick Neck wind bound all hands  
at ships duty at 6 cleared the decks for the  
night Middle Light and overcast still lay  
wind bound of the light Lateral Light and  
overcast so ends

Tuesday 15<sup>th</sup> 1841  
Light from the South at anchor of the light  
all hands employed in lashing spars and clearing  
ship and other duties Middle fine at 7 pm  
the wind hauled to the N.W. Lateral fine winds at  
8 pm hoist up anchor and stood out for sea at  
12 landed the Pilot so ends

Wednesday 16<sup>th</sup>  
Fine winds from the N.W. a number of vessels  
in sight at 3 pm Block Island bore N.W. at 6 hoist  
from which I take my departure at 6 tack on  
to the S.W. the S. by E Middle and Lateral fine  
Lat 40.31 Long 70.47
