Remarks on board Ship Lion July 19<sup>th</sup> & 20<sup>th</sup>  
At 8 AM get underway and stood out to sea. At 10 AM  
discharged the pilot and steered S by W. Employed  
filling the boats and breaking out for  
provisions. Latter part light wind heading E. S. E.

Remarks on board Ship Lion Friday July 21<sup>st</sup>  
Light variable winds and calms working to the S. E.  
Employed getting boats & sails in sight.  
Lat. 40.59 Long. 70.28

Saturday July 22<sup>nd</sup>  
Light variable winds working to S. E. employed  
getting boats and, lashing up sails in sight.  
Lat. 40.59 Long. 70.55

Sunday July 23<sup>rd</sup>  
Light variable winds working to S. E. Spoke the  
Ship "1<sup>st</sup>" of Greenport. At 7 AM breeze sprung up from  
S. E. steered S by E. 3 sails in sight.  
Lat. 40.13 Long. 70.04

Monday July 24<sup>th</sup>  
Moderate breeze from S. E. steering S. E. employed in  
ship duty 5 sails in sight.  
Lat. 39.58 Long. 68.30

Tuesday July 25<sup>th</sup>  
Light wind from S. E. steering S by E. employed getting  
the boats and rigging.  
Lat. 38.59 Long. 65.26

Wednesday July 26<sup>th</sup>  
Light wind from S. E. steering S by E. employed break-  
ing out for provisions.  
Lat. 37.06 Long. 63.15
