The Sloop of War Cumberland
Aug 3rd 1847

Sunday Aug 3rd 1847
At 7 A.M. took and anchor off
Sulphur Point and at 8 out to sea with the
S.S. at 10 A.M. discharge the 1600 lbs

Monday Aug 4th
Commenced with gentle wind from the
North and cloudy ship steering to the South
at 3 P.M. discovered land bearing S.S.W. 10 West
at the same distance mid & latter part strong
and ruffled ship under double reefed

Tuesday 5th
Came with strong wind from the North and
thick steering S.W. mid & latter part smooth the
same as
Lat 55 40
Long 55 40

Wednesday 6th
Came with strong wind and cloudy
steering S.W. mid & latter part strong wind
and clear all sail out to sea Lat 55 36
Long 53 18

Thursday 7th
Came with strong wind from the N.W.
and pleasant steering S.W. with all sail out
and back in sight steering to the Eastward
Lat 54 30 N
Long 50 40 W

Friday 8th
Commenced with gentle wind from
the S.W. ship heading E.S. mid part gentle
wind and pleasant latter part strong wind from
the S.W. at 12 took 2000 lbs of the stores
Lat 53 10
Long 47 20
