

Ship Land in Atlantic June 1838
From June 25th. Inward trade, steering S. by W.
with all sail on deck. Ship making good head
Latitude 36. 20. 45 N. Longitude 19. 29. 00 W.

June 26th. Inward trade and heavy weather
steering S. by W. with all sail on deck.
Latitude 36. 20. 45 N. Longitude 19. 29. 00 W.

June 27th. Light and heavy trades steering
S. by W. with all sail on deck. Ship making
Latitude 36. 20. 45 N. Longitude 19. 29. 00 W.

June 28th. Inward trade and steady steering
at 4 P.M. saw the side of sail bearing S. by W.
at 6 P.M. made on a wind to the S. by W. bearing
S. W. on one tack & on the other at 8 P.M. saw
a few low mountains bearing S. W. and kept off
about 10 P.M. at 11 P.M. saw a small island
at 10 P.M. on board with him at 11. 30 P.M.
have tea in 8 p.m. weather here broken
and commenced flogging the by the head to get
at the lead etc. etc.

June 29th. Inward trade at 5 P.M. left
harbour and steering W. at 6 P.M. left off W. S. W.
at 4 P.M. of S. W. at 6 P.M. saw low mountains
S. W. point distant 20 miles wind bearing S. E.

June 30th. light air and barometer falling to the
South West with all sail on board under
the Island of Fogo and a head barometer etc.

July 1st. light wind weather to the
West with a ship and got a strong gale from
trade working up a bay to the S. E. part
of Fogo at 4 P.M. had to go on shore to
take the Postage in the boat etc.
