Quarried on board Monday 26th of May 1884
 First part of 8 AM got away from the dock
 and anchored in the stream to wait for tides
 at 10 got under way and stood out of the
 river at 11 the tug kept us at 11.30 the tug
 kept schooner steering S W B E at noon
 part the sun and pigs bright sky hauled up
 S B W and end this day Lat 41.08 N
 Long 71.07 W

Remarks on board Tuesday 27th
 First part fine wind from N E scho steering
 S B W hand employed in ship duty
 Middle part latter part some foggy wind
 N E at 8 AM scho steering S W B E
 at 10 steered S W ends this day
 Lat 39.58 N Long 71.33 W
