Bound to the Cape of Good Hope

Friday March 30th 1832

Sixty of
Corn,
Sixteen
of Butter

This 24 hours commences with light winds from N.W.
and pleasant weather latter parts the same at 9 A.M.
got under way for sea with a fair and a pleasant
gale. So ends this day.

Saturday March 31st 1832

Barrel of
Bacon & Fat,
Sixty of
Molasses

This day begins with light winds from N.W. and
pleasant weather at 2 P.M. the wind hauled out
S.W. at 5 P.M. led her anchor of Partridge Island
latter parts winds the same and thick weather employed
in getting the boat to end this day.

Sunday April 1st 1832

This Day begins with fresh gale from S.W. and thick
weather. Middle and latter parts the same. So ends.

Monday April 2nd 1832

This Day commences with fresh gale from S.W.
and thick weather latter parts winds from N.W.
and pleasant weather at 4 A.M. got under way
for sea with all sail set to the best advantage.
at 9 A.M. carried away the Fore Top mast stuck
down and got up another and set the sail at 11 A.M.
taken the stunsail and hauled on the mizzen to the
westward So ends This Days work.

Tuesday April 3rd 1832

This Day begins with strong gale from N.W. and
clear weather at 8 P.M. reefed Fore Sails latter
part winds N.W. and thick weather So ends the Day.
