

Friday
August 7th
1835

Bound to the Western isles

This 24 hours commenced with fine weather and gentle breezes from SW. Coars P & E hands employed in ships duty at 1 pm. At the fore to the mast. All the middle and latter part. Squally weather so ends this 24 hours. Lat 39.50 N Long 20.50 W

Saturday
August 8th
1835

This 24 hours commenced with more breeze from SW Coars P & E hands employed in ships duty all the middle and latter part. Squally weather wind hail so ends this 24 hours. Lat 39.50 N Long 20.50 W

Sunday
August 9th
1835

This 24 hours commenced with strong winds from N. Coars P & E hands employed in ships duty middle part fine weather latter part the same at 4 pm saw whales board and got one to the stern along side got up the tables and began to cut so ends this 24 hours. Lat 39.50 N Long 20.50 W

Monday
August 10th
1835

Commenced with fine weather continue cutting at 7 pm got all in cleared away for cutting the head & c. At 4 pm commenced cutting junk at 8 pm commenced boiling head continues fine weather all the latter part so ends this 24 hours. Latitude 39.50 N Long 20.50 W

August 11th
1835

This 24 hours commenced with fine weather and light breeze from SW all hands employed in boiling middle part of latter part. Weather continue boiling so ends Lat 39.50 N

Wednesday
August 12th
1835

This 24 hours commenced with fine weather gentle breezes one watch employed in boiling. Saw 2 sails at 6 pm saw a large whale boat 2 boats being in late did not get him came on board all the middle and latter part. In latter part saw a great many letters and grammasses one watch below and the rest employed so ends Lat 39.50 N Long 20.50 W

Thursday
August 13th
1835

Bound to the Western isles

This 24 hours commenced with gentle breezes from SW steered to the SE at 4 pm wind hauled more to the N tacked ship and proceeded to the S hands employed in ships duty all the middle part fine weather latter part broke out and stored down so ends this 24 hours. Lat 40.5 N Longitude 35.50 West

Friday
August 14th
1835

This 24 hours commenced with gentle breezes from the SW Coars P & E all hands employed. In steaming at 10 pm finished weather calm. Fine steady 4.5 sails - all the middle and latter part. Fine weather saw 2 sails. Nothing more so ends. Lat 39.50 N Long 35.50 W

Saturday
August 15th
1835

Commenced with light air from SW Coars P & E at 1 pm saw blackbird board but lost sight of them one watch employed in ships duty all the middle and latter part. Fine weather and light winds hands employed in ships duty. Nothing more so ends this 24 hours. Latitude 40.5 N Longitude 35.50 West

Sunday
August 16th
1835

This 24 hours commenced with light air from SW steered close to on the star tack one watch employed in ships duty at 8 pm a shoal of whales came close to the ship and then spinn. Phales they headed to the North by flow all the middle and latter part light air at 9 am saw a shoal of grammasses board they were sperm whales at 10 am picked up a stick of timber. Nothing more so ends. This 24 hours Lat 40.35 N Long 35.50 West

Monday
August 17th
1835

This 24 hours commenced with light winds from SW Coars P & E 9 sails in sight steered to the S and Eastward at 8 pm discovered the island of Florus and came steered P & E all the middle and latter part with squally rainy weather. Latter part in a great many letters and grammasses one watch below and the rest employed so ends Lat 29.59 N Long 30.15 West
