

Bound to the western island

Tuesday
August
18th 1835

This 24 hours commences with strong breezes from N.W. covers 1/2 thick clouds weather fine watch below and the rest employed in ships duty all the middle parts light breeze from E.P.E. star 1/2 side of Fayall but could not get along side nothing more so ends latitude 28° 23' N Long 28° 49'

Wednesday
August
19th 1835

Commences with gentle breezes and strong east in under Fayall beating to wind. Beca me watch employed and the rest below all the middle part say off and on at 5 am sent a boat in to Yaco to see if had potatoes but seeing none more that appeared to be head we came on board and put back for Fayall at 10 pm latitude 28° 23' N Long 28° 48' West

Thursday
August
20th 1835

Commences with light winds and calm at 2 pm a boat came along side we trade for fruit at 3 pm a good breeze from the land started per toward Fayall all right tacked and half tacked in the morning went on shore to trade at 12 M had moca all ends latitude Fayall 28° 29' Long 28° 48'

Friday
August
21st 1835

Commences with strong wind from N.W. at 5 pm had all on board made sail and steered out but left my 3 letters by negligence and the middle and latter parts fine weather got up all the potatoes and mango and dried them so ends this 24 hours latitude 27° 49' N Long 28° 55'

Saturday
August
22nd 1835

This 24 hours commences with gentle breezes from N.W. covers 1/2 thick clouds weather fine watch in stowage the potatoes &c. middle and latter parts light winds from the same quarter broke out in the day the hole got out D. apples moca & sugar also can so ends latitude 25° 55' N

Bound to the Trustean Ground

Sunday
August
23rd 1835

This 24 hours commences with fine kind of weather covers 1/2 with wind to 8 miles watch employed in ships duty &c all the middle and latter parts light breeze from E.P.E. star 1/2 side of ends This 24 hours latitude 27° 26' N Long 28° 41'

Monday
August
24th 1835

This 24 hours commences with light air from E.P.E. star 1/2 side weather fine and sea smooth all the middle and latter parts the same saw a brig ass we thought bound home her way for her but she would not stop so ends latitude 23° 44' N Long 28° 31' West

Tuesday
August
25th 1835

Commences with strong top gale from E.P.E. star 1/2 side covers 1/2 in ships duty cap sick with fever & ague all the middle and latter parts strong winds with heavy sea so ends this 24 hours latitude 22° 00' Long 28° 03'

Wednesday
August
26th 1835

This 24 hours commences with strong winds from E star 1/2 side weather fine for lack at 1 pm got up water and continued strong all the first part with thick clouds weather and heavy sea all middle and latter parts hands employed in ships duty so ends this 24 hours latitude 20° 24' longitude 26° 19' West

Thursday
August
27th 1835

This 24 hours commences with gentle breezes from E star 1/2 side weather fine for lack hand employed in ships duty all the middle and latter parts fine weather so ends latitude 28° 58' N Long 25° 25' West

Friday
August
28th 1835

Commences with fine weather gentle breeze from E.P.E. star 1/2 side weather fine for lack hand employed in ships duty all the middle and latter parts strong winds so ends this 24 hours latitude 27° 18' N Long 24° 40'
