worked down with light airs

At 12 AM bore too Cuttershank bearing
N 8 E 1/2 S but after heaving the ship
L & Richmond took a southerly wind

Remarks Monday Sunday June 6th 1841

At 12 h 30 AM P.M. discharged the Pilot
and owners hung on by the Wind to the
West at 4 AM tacked the NW part of
Black Island bearing S by W

At 6 h 30 P.M. passed and different tacks
L & Richmond 6 miles to Windward
of her latter part moderate breeze and
fair weather At 8 P.M. saw land bore
N 8 1/2 miles S by E latter part fine weather
kept on the eastern tack 114 to 114

Obs in lat 40-34 Long 69-10

Remarks Tuesday June 7th 1841

These 24 hours moderate breeze from
West to SW evening off to the S.W.
all hands set as they were set sea
net and set of the crew
