

Half Month's Log Book on a Whaling Voyage to the

Remarks on Sunday 14th July 1835

Commenced with light breezes from the S.W. and pleasant steering S by E. Ship Liverpool in sight off the coast. Middle and latter part heavy light airs from the S.W. The Liverpool in Co. and one strange ship steering to the North so early with light airs from the S.W. Steer S by E. Lat 39° 37' N

Remarks on Monday 15th July 1835

These 24 hours commences with light airs from the South steering S by E. Ship Liverpool in Co. Middle part mostly latter part pleasant breezes from the S.W. and fair weather so early employed at sundown. Lat 40° 14' N Longy by Chron 52° 13'

Remarks on Tuesday 16th July 1835

Commences with pleasant breezes from the S.W. and fair weather steering to the Eastward by the Wind Middle part the same Lat 40° 16' Tacked to the Southward Latter part moderate wind from the Eastward employed at ship's deavies, Ship Liverpool in sight at midnight Lat 40° 47'

Remarks on Wednesday 17th July 1835

This day commences with moderate breezes from the S.W. and fair weather by the wind to the S.E. Middle and latter part moderate breezes from the Eastward by the wind to the South with full sail. Ship Liverpool in sight and weather better and strange sail in sight ahead

Lat 40° 39' 46" Longy by Chron 51° 55' 20"

Atlantic Ocean, Charles Fisher Master: 1835

Remarks on Thursday 18th July 1835

These 24 hours commences with moderate breezes from the East and fair weather all sail set by the Wind to the Southward. Ship Liverpool in sight Middle part equally at 3 P.M. Tacked to the S.W. Latter part pleasant breezes from the S.W. and fair weather by the wind to the East two ships in sight bound to the Eastward 9 Days out

Lat 40° 22' N Longy by Chron 52° 13'

Remarks on Friday 19th July 1835

Commences with moderate breezes from the S.W. and fair weather by the wind to the East all sail set to the best advantage. Middle part equally at Menden fair weather and from the S.W. by the wind to the S.W. Ship Liverpool in sight and weather better so early with two men sick & off duty

Lat 40° 43' Longy by Chron 52° 13'

Remarks on Saturday 20th July 1835

These 24 hours commences with fresh breezes from the S.W. and passing clouds by the wind to the Eastward Ship Liverpool in sight and the weather better Middle and latter part light airs from the S.W. and fair weather so early these 24 hours Ship Liverpool in Co

Lat 41° 04' N Longy by Chron 52° 13'

Remarks on Sunday 21st July 1835

Commences with heavy light airs from the S.W. and fair weather by the wind to the Eastward at 5 P.M. bound down the coast and heeled round to press the wind Middle and latter part light airs from the S.W. Ship Liverpool in Co. and one other ship to the South so early these 24 hours

Lat 41° 10' Longy by Chron 52° 13'
