

Remarks on Board Ship Martha Fairbanks

Monday June 25<sup>th</sup> 1838

The first part weather thick and foggy ship set anchor off the light waiting for a wind with wind later at 4 AM five men took a boat and departed the ship sent the pilot boat after steam at 10 AM returned with all but one man's sail and part to sea

Tuesday June 26<sup>th</sup>

The first part weather thick and foggy at 3 PM wind to anchor under main sail and wind from the WSW with wind later part under main at 5 PM took the anchor and part to sea

Wednesday June 27<sup>th</sup>

The first part steady wind from the WSW steering out 828 at 6 PM got head down for compass North Dist 10 miles with wind later part much the same

Lat by Ant 40.17 Long 70.34

Thursday June 28<sup>th</sup>

The first part light wind from the SE heading to the Eastward three sail in night with wind later part same squally same

Lat by Ant 40.43 Long 59.31

Friday June 29<sup>th</sup>

The first part steady breeze from the SE by S East all sail set with wind later part same squally took in the topgallant sails and spinnaker

Lat by Ant 40.20 Long 69.14

Saturday June 30<sup>th</sup>

The first part same with light wind from the W lower SE by E with wind later part much the same heavy breeze with on board

Lat by Ant 39.25 Long 67.45
