Wednesday Aug 15 th 1873

Begins with fresh breezes from S. and thick.  
at 9 A M took the anchor and sailed from  
St Bedford. beat out of the bay.

Remarks Thursday Aug 16 th

Begins with moderate breezes from S.  
beating out of the bay. At 5 1/2 P M they left  
us. Stew & Sibb West bearing S. N. dist  
4 miles. at 9 P hearing E N E dist 6 miles.  
Middle part calm and foggy. Latter part moderate  
at 8 Breezes from W SSW steering S E. Heard  
the fog whistle of light boat all night. at 6  
A M it was bearing N E by S dist 10 miles.  
At noon no land bearing N dist 15 miles.  
So ends pleasant breeze. Lat 40-52 Lang 69-56

Remarks Friday Aug. 17 th

Begins with light & breeze from S SW. Course  
S E. A heavy fog fell. all sail set.  
Employed fitting the boats for whaling. & I  
am lame sick. And my poor little dog is to.  
I hope the Lord will help us and return us to  
our home and friends. we found a stowaway  
On board to day. A boy he belonged at Malachano.  
Latter part moderate breeze from S SW. Saw  
a Bark steering to the Eastward. Employed  
fitting boats and cutting gear for whaling.  
Lat 40-02 Lang 68-34

Remarks Saturday Aug 18 th

Begins with breezes from the S by W steering  
off to Eastward. Saw two sail. Latter part  
moderate breeze from S SW steering  
S E. Engt the cutting implements aloft and  
lashed them lashed the spar, and got  
boat ready for whaling. Saw three  
sails.

Remarks Sunday Aug 19 th 1873  
Begins with light & breeze from S SW  
S E. Three hills in sight. Latter part light  
airs and calms. Lat 38-54

Remarks Monday Aug 20 th  
Begins with light airs and calms. At  
5 P M took a Breeze from S SW.  
Heaving by to the N E. Latter part moderate  
and rising. No Obs

Remarks Tuesday Aug 21<sup>st</sup>  
Begins with fresh breezes from S E and  
thick. At 6 P M took it. had light sails. At  
8 Double reefed the Main Sails. furled Main  
Sail fbb and Spanker. At 9<sup>th</sup> the wind  
hauled to the westward in a heavy squall.  
parted the main top sail sheet. Clasped the  
top sail hauled up the fore sail and  
steered S. At 12 the wind began to haul to  
the N. did not stop until it got to N E.  
Latter part very squally. At 7 A M the  
wind hauled to E S E. Heaving by to the  
N E under double reefs.  
Lat 38-36 Lang 61-22

Remarks Wednesday 22<sup>nd</sup>

Begins with strong winds and heavy  
squalls from the S and S E. Under double  
reefs parasol 29<sup>1/10</sup>. plenty of thunder  
and lightning day 29<sup>1/10</sup> Lat 39-08. This obs

Remarks Thursday 23<sup>rd</sup>

Begins with strong winds and squalls  
from S E. gradually hauling to the S.  
At 6 P M Clasped. At 1/2 P M wind  
S E blowing a gale. With a bad sea.  
put her off E NE. and ran under Clasped  
reefs and fore sail. Latter more moderate.  
Made sail for about two hr. Lat 39-11 Lang 57-12
