

Bark Mary Hayes of New Bedford Capt (1867)
Oct 8th Began with fine weather Capt
Hayes from NE took the Ancho at
10.15 Am cleared round hills at noon
Sounded the day

Oct 9th Began with
light breeze and calm variable winds
at 2 Pm at 3 Pm got a breeze from
SW the Pilot left at 4 Pm cleared
and hank at 6 Pm and steered S half
E wind from NW at dark went Starboard
Chain and stowed the Anchors and set
the Watch stowed the Chains at daylight
and began to get the Boat ready saw 2 sails
Sounded the day

Oct 10th Began with
fine weather and breeze from SW steered
SE by East & saw Blackfish and 2 sails
all hands employed heaving out the fore
hold and getting boat ready for Whaling
Lat 39.47 Long 69.29
began to break out the main water
at daylight for boat all hands rainy
weather set in at 4 o'clock so ended the day

Saturday Oct 11th Began with
rainy weather watch employed variously
clear weather and strong breeze set
in at 4 Pm double reefed at sundown
wind from SW steered SE by East
rainy and stormy all night and at the
fore noon found one man that was
stowed away by the Portuguese shark
so ended the day Lat 39.34
