

Monday October 3 - 1859 Steering by
the wind on the larboard tack. Cloudy with
strong winds: knotting rope yarns, broke
out Bread and water, saw finbackes

Tuesday October 4 - 1859 Cloudy with strong wind
steering by the wind on the larboard tack: drawing and
knotting rope yarns: at night wore ship

Wednesday October 5 - 1859 -
making Spungarn raised Woods Island
at noon three points on the lee bow: saw
finbackes Crampuses and asail

Thursday October 6 - 1859 - at daylight
Woods Island on the lee beam: wore ship
to the Eastward: making Spungarn

Friday October 7 - 1859
at daylight Woods Island on the lee bow
Chatham on the lee quarter: saw finbackes and Porpoises
running down past Chatham Is. saw the Seconet at anchor in Block Bay

Saturday October 8 - 1859
Strong wind with rain at daylight wore ship
Chatham Island ahead: standing in towards
the ~~Lower~~ Island untill eleven A.M. when we
hove up and squared the yards: at night luffed too
on the starboard tack

Sunday October 9 - 1859
at daylight wore ship to the Westward: one o'clock
P.M. raised Lower Island three points on the weather
Bow: at night Abington James and Bindons
Islands in sight: wore ship to the Eastward

Monday October 10 - 1859
at daylight Lower Island on the weather beam
Bindons and James Island ahead Abington Is
on the lee bow: in the afternoon sent two boats
in at Bindons to fish

Tuesday October 11 - 1859
at daylight Abbermark Island ahead. Bindons
and James Island on the weather beam: saw
Sulphur Bottoms finbackes Blackfish: lowered for Bl. fish
at night: between Abbermark and Rounded rock
