took him along side and Com. Cutting at 9
P.M. finished saw several sail latter
part the ship under short sail heading
N.W. all hands employed cutting up
and boiling out the whale

Tuesday Sept 6th

Begins with strong gales from the S.W.
with clear weather the ship under short
sail heading N.W. all hands employed
boiling the whale saw two whalers
and several merchantmen at sunset
finished the fore part middle part the
same latter part blowing strong
with a heavy sea running at sunset saw
sperm whales all round us Gallied by
the ship. Leeward got none close the
starboard and west boats taking
them up saw a Bark Clew down
to the windward supposed that she got
a whale Lat 39.45 Long 47.20

Remarks Cruising on the Western Ground
Wednesday Sept 7th

Begins with strong gales from the S.W.
with passing clouds and heavy sea
the ship heading N.W. under short sail
the wack employed boiling out saw one
sail middle part blowing heavy with
rain at 4 A.M. finished boiling latter
part light air and calm with a heavy
sea one whale in sight a boiling

Thursday Sept 8th

Begins with moderate gales from the west
with passing clouds the ship heading N.W.
one sail in sight boiling latter part light
air and calm with a heavy sea running two
sail in sight Lat Long

Friday Sept 9th

Begins with light air from the North
with clear weather the ship under short
sail heading west one sail in sight
at 6 P.M. finished sawing down 35
Barrels of Sperm oil middle and latter
part the same one whale in sight a boiling

Saturday Sept 10th

Begins with light air from the North
with clear weather the ship heading westward
at 4 P.M. saw a whales Boats down
they shortly went on board at the same
time we saw a sulphur Bottom at
sunset this time sail at daylight saw
sperm whales all round going quick to the leeward
ward a gallied by the ship toward all three
boats and give chase in company with boats
from the Porpoise William and Henry of
Pearl Harbor the whale going first
to the leeward and then to the windward
