

Remarks Cruising on the Western Ground
at 11 A.M. gave them up and came on Board

4 Months out with 200 Barrels of Sperm
the wind hauled S.E. and Com. raining
Lat Long

Sunday Sept 11th

Begins with strong gales from the S.E.
with thick rainy weather the ship heading
S. by N. at 1 P.M. the top sail at 4 P.M.
furl'd the fore top sail and gave ship
back up the sea Beasts pumped ship
Bared down the hatches and made
all snug at 8 P.M. Com. blowing
a gale from the south furl'd
the fore sail at 10 P.M. blowing
a perfect hurricane the wind hauled
from South to S.W. called all hands
and furl'd the main top sail took in
the fore top mast stay sail and main
spencer sheet the pumps at 10 P.M.
more moderate made sad as required
ends with fresh gales from the N.W.
with a heavy sea the ship heading S.W.
Lat 39 53 Long 42 55

Monday Sept 12th

Begins with moderate gales from the
N.W. with a very rough sea the under short
sail heading N.E. Middle and latter part
blowing a heavy gale from the S.W. with
a heavy sea running the ship heading S.W.
lying to under fore top mast stay sail
and main spencer the pumps attended
to
Lat Long

Clear weather after 10 P.M.

Tuesday Sept 13th

Begins with a heavy gale from the N.W.
with a heavy sea the ship lying to
on the southern tack under stay sail
and main spencer at 3 P.M. sent
down fore and main top gallant
yards latter part the same to the
fore and main top gallant
part more moderate with passing squalls
Lat 40.02 Long 44.46

Wednesday Sept 14th

Begins with a gale from the N.W.
with passing squalls and heavy swell
the ship heading South under stay sail
and main spencer at 3 P.M. sent the
main top sail reefed took the pumps
no leak in her state again that the
ships leak is little or none scarcely
getting ~~any~~ enough to keep the pumps
latter part more moderate with a heavy
westerly ground swell set fore course and
shut off S.E. at 10 with set reefed fore
top sail one sail in sight
Lat 39 24 Long 42 06

Thursday Sept 15th

Begins with strong gales from the N.W.
with clear weather the ship under short
sail steering S.E. at 3 P.M. saw a school
of sperm whales going 9 M. ch. to the
wind wind hauled all three Beasts and
at 4 P.M. the Larboard Beasts struck a small
whale and took him to the ship the starboard
Beasts struck and lost a small whale at
sun set shortened sail latter part blowing
strong with a heavy swell at day light Com. S.
Cutting had to give up Cutting it was
rough
