Saturday 14

Commences with strong winds and rugged weather two boats chasing Black fish at 2 o'clock P.M. gave them up and came on board Middle part strong winds from the S.E. with much rain latter part very squally weather so ends

Commences with strong winds and squally weather from the S by W heading E by E crew employed in various parts of ships duty at 5 P.M. passed a large ship steering east Middle part blowing a gale of wind from the S.W. vessel here to under close reefed main foresail and fore topmast staysail latter part very squally with much rain set the foresail and close reefed fore topsail so ends this day

Commencing with strong winds and squally weather from the S.W. ship steering S by E at sundown blowing a gale took in the fore topsail Middle and latter parts the same passed a Brigg steering to the Eastward so ends

Commences with blowing a gale from the W.S.W. with a heavy sea running ship here to S by E. at 3 P.M. moderated some set the foresail at sundown wind increasing furled the foresail again Middle and latter part blowing hard with heavy squally vessel here to heading S. wind W.S.W. so ends

Commences with strong breeze from the W ship steering E.S.E. crew employed breaking out the flubber room for meat Middle part light wind with rain squally from the W. S.W. latter part fine pleasant weather steering E.S.E. crew employed in various parts of ships duty so ends this day

Commences with light winds and fine pleasant weather from the W. S.W. vessel steering E.S.E. crew employed in various parts of ships duty at sundown took in sail for the night and brought her to for the night by the wind heading west Middle & latter part light winds at daylight made sail and kept her E by S. so ends

Commences with light winds and pleasant weather from the S.W. steering E.S.E. saw plenty of porpoises crew employed in various parts of ships duty Middle and latter parts light winds and fine weather course the same so ends

Commences with light winds and fine weather from the W.S.W. steering E.S.E. crew employed in various of ships duty 2 sails in sight steering east at sundown took in sail for the night and brought her by the wind heading S Middle and latter part continues fine weather all sail set and 2 ships in sight
