

Saturday
the 8th
1830

This Day Commenced with light airs & Calms the painter is painting the Commons off the patches and gum imployed in scrapping and getting the riggin at 4 in the afternoon slight breeze sprang W. from the North East and at 6 heard the Decks latitude at 12 was 6° 58'

Sunday
the 9th
1830

This Day Commenced with light winds and Calms Showers off rain all hands Emplod in saving Weather continued squally all the Day and Rainy at 4 took a squall off wind the bar fell about 10 minutes and then became calm so ends this Day Latitude at 12 was 2° 22'

Monday
the 10th
1830

This Day Commenced with Calms and light airs all hands Emplod in Ships Duty at 10 in the fore noon caught a shark for his skin our dog bit some of the meat and it poisoned him in the afternoon on bent the main sprail and bent the old one at 4 in the afternoon sent down the old topgallant yard and sent Mr. A new one so ends this Day with Calms Latitude at 12 was 2° 40'

Tuesday
the 11th
May 1830

This Day Commenced with Gentle breezes from the N.E. and smooth sea at 9 in the morning mended the old fore topsail and at 11 bent him and then went to working out the oil between Decks to find the leak brook all out the Star side and found the Casks all full and then Stode back at Sun set found it at 8 had a fine breeze from the N.E. so ends this Day Latitude at 12 was 3° 18'

Wednesday
the 12th
May 1830

This Day Commenced with a strong gale from the N.E. all hands Emplod in Ships Duty so ends this Day Latitude at 12 was 3° 41'

Thursday
the 13th
May 1830

This Day Commenced with strong breeze from the N.E. Broke out the after to look for a leak but found none spoke the manthor off new bedford caps were in at 12 finished and then went to work on the riggin saw an other sail off the lee bow about 5 miles off at 4 in the afternoon she was 2 points off the weather bow at 6 continued so ends this Day Latitude at 12 was 6° 19' South Long 48° 22'

Friday
the 14th
May 1830

This Day Commenced with strong gales from the N.E. and heavy buff all hands Emplod in Ships Duty at 10 it became squally continued so all Day at 5 Nocked off and heard the Deck so ends this Day Latitude at 12 was 7° 48' Course steered on N.W.

Saturday
the 15th
May 1830

This Day Commenced with strong gales and squall off wind only in the morning wet the bil down Emplod in Ships Duty saw 3 sails standing to the South so ends this Day Latitude at 12 was 9° 48' South

Sunday
the 16th
May 1830

This 24 hours Commenced with strong gales and buff sea at 10 in the fore noon saw 5 sails to the North West Course at N. nothing gained on this Day so ends Latitude at 12 was 11° 47' Longitude 48° 50' West

Monday
the 17th
May 1830

This Day fine Wind from S.E. and clear saw a ship to the windward off the bow at 4 she was about 10 miles off for 20 miles. Sea to leeward water enclosed in Ships Duty the painter is mended so ends this Day Latitude at 12 was 13° 27'
