

The Smack "Minnie" Capt W. H. Appelm
sailed from Mystic for New West Oct 3^d 1865 with
fresh breezes from the N. Stopped at New London for
jit topsail. At sunset anchored under Pine Island
ficalm.

Oct 4th Got underway at 8 a. m. Took in 100
bony fish. At 3 P. M. fresh breezes from the N.
At sunset 20 miles S.W. by S from Montauk Point.
wind increases. Schooner "Albert Haley" in company.

Oct 5th This day commences with squalls from the
N. At 5 a. m. reefed mainsail. Squalls continued
all day. At 6 P. M. set topsail. At 3 P. M. passed
a schooner with foresail gone. No latitude.

Oct 6th This day commences with fresh breezes from
the N. at 9 a. m. set mainsail weather moderated
At 12 m Lat 36.44 N saw 5 steamers. weather fine.

Oct 7th This day commences with light breezes from
the N. At 12 P. M. Lat 34.34 N. At sunset calm
caught 70 sea bass.

Oct 8th Becalm'd all day. Lat 34.12 N. 19 fathoms water.

Oct 9th This day commences with light baffling winds.
At 12 m Lat 33.55 N. At sunset a steady breeze from
the S.E. 22 fathoms water. caught a few fish.

Oct 10. This day commences with fresh breezes from
the N.W. At 4 a. m. Spoke a gunboat at the point
of Frying Pan Shoals. At 11 a. m. hove to and
caught 250 sea bass in 10 fathoms of water.
Frying Pan Light Ship bearing N.E. by E. distance
25 miles. Sunset calm. Latitude 33.30 N.
