

Aug 14th North Atlantic Steer^g Easterly Borneo

This day divided the crew into three watches of 8 men each, weather moderate and pleasant, saw one brig Steer^g East
Lat in 37.05 Long 35.24

Aug 15th Friday commoner moderate and pleasant from the North East, Steer^g south weather continues pleasant throughout the day
Lat in 34.48N 39.08W

Aug 16th Saturday comes in fresh with flying clouds from the North East continues so throughout the day
Lat in 22.09 - 38.07W

Aug 17th Sunday, moderate with damp lowering weather wind more from the east, middle watch the same, latter hours sunshine with flying clouds
Lat in 19.16N 26.56.30W

Aug 18th Monday, moderate and overcast with boffling easterly winds Cape de Verde Island Cape Antony, 12 m bearing SE by S distance 60 miles Day was pleasant
Lat in 17.31N 26.33W

Aug 19th Tuesday first watch moderate and squally with rain from the east, middle watch calm with heavy southerly swell continues the same throughout the day saw one sail this day Borneo south
Lat in 15.32N 25.56W

New South Shettarries

Aug 20th calm still weather from the south, and rolling sea, first part two sails in sight Borneo southerly, rain squalls in the distance The middle watch has been the same and hot and sultry too.

This day there ~~was~~ many sail in sight I believe we have counted nine and all save one, was steering north, and she towards the line, Lat 15.14, Long 26.00

Aug 21th Thursday, increasing breeze from the north with heavy south west swell middle and latter hours more moderate several vessels in sight mostly steering " westerly Lat in 13.26

Aug 22th Friday moderate all through these 24 hours with heavy southern swell, saw three ships this day & steering south and one north ends very warm. Lat in 12.14

Aug 23 Saturday moderate, overcast, weather from the north, all these 24 hours several sail in sight, Borneo different ways heavy head Beat, sea all day. Lat in 10.43

Aug 24th Sunday, dark & cloudy with squalls from the south west and some rain, Borneo fresh no observation this day for the first time. Lat in 7.55 Long 23.18

Aug 25th Monday fresh squally weather from the S.W. all these twenty four hours, and heavy head Beat, sea saw two sails this day, one steering north and the other south. Lat in 7.55 Long 23.18
