

35 Days out

August 26th commences moderate from the south west and so continues throughout all these 24 hours two brigs in sight both bound south & showing Brazilian flag. Day ends pleasant.

36 August 27th Wednesday commences moderate and continues so throughout the day. Tacks ship to the west at 8 a.m. and put about at 6 a.m. but going slow.

37 August 28th Thursday comes moderate and rain squalls heavy because from the south west and so continues through the day. Same time.

38 Days August 29th Friday fresh breezes from the south west and squally heavy southern sea with hard work getting south. Much water squalls and rain. Latter wind hauls southward.

39 August 30th Saturday fine moderate G & E trades. and clear schooner going slow. Broke out water this day. ends pleasant.

40 August 31st Sunday comes in fresh breeze from the S & E and so continues throughout the day. pleasant steering S by West by compass.

September 1st Monday comes in fresh wind S & E seen and boarded by Italian Bark (Victor) from pangoon Hindoostan for Salmouth England. Furnishes him 1 Bl Port for which we rec^d 50. one each went on their way. middle and latter hours moderate and clear wind south.

41 Days out

Tuesday commences moderate from the S & East. smooth and pleasant middle and latter hours strong breezes from the south and east. crosses the equatorial line this day.

Wednesday strong gales from the south & East accompanied with squalls of rain with heavy head beat sea. Schooner deeper fine and after one going slow. made the Island of Fernando Norona bearing North West. distant 11 miles. latter hours fresh plenty tropic & whale birds in sight.

Thursday strong gale and squalls from the south S East, with bigger head sea. no observation this day.

Friday strong gales from the south. one heavy head beat sea. all through these 24 hours. made the coast of Brazil and stood in too the land in latitude 6.19. passed many fishermen of the coast busy in pursuit of fish. an attempt to describe their boats would be a failure. more than say. so many logs secured together and a sail stuck in the middle.

Saturday strong gales from the south with an ugly sea working to, or trying to work to windward. Lost three miles of latitude this day. saw three ships and two brigs. the first working south and the latter steering north. Day ends unfavorably with the coast in sight. Lat near 6.16. of the river Parahaty. Long 33. 5. 6. 7.
