

# Journal of a Voyage in the Ship

Nov. 14<sup>th</sup> 1841

At 7 o'clock weighed anchor abreast of Clandon Point, wind N.E. at 4 P.M. sea bet Adams Land bore S by E. Distance 16 miles from which I take my Departure winds variable untill 6 A.M. then hauled to the N.W. Course S.E. Latitude at noon 40. 23 N

the boats after a long chase the waste boat  
Jutena and Spruce Latitude at noon 34. 56 S.

Tuesday 11<sup>th</sup>

Fine Moderate weather saw Whales  
lowered two boats the Larboard boat struck  
a large one and got badly stove took him  
alongside at 7 P. M. commenced buting  
at 4 A. M. Lat 34 46 S.

Wednesday 12<sup>th</sup>

Saw a Whale a short distance from  
the ship saw a Brig to leeward of us  
taking a Whale Alongside finished buting  
at 9 P. M. commenced boiling at 5 A. M.  
some little rain the Latter part no obs-  
Thursday 13<sup>th</sup>

Shook a cask in the Ground and set  
it up for oil trying out then 24 hours  
boiled by and Fork

Remarks Monday 17<sup>th</sup> Jan<sup>y</sup>. 1842  
Light breezes from N.E. and Cloudy  
at 7 P.M. Houtle reefed the Topsails

Commenced repairing the Fresh water that  
was taken out of the hold on Saturday.  
Shooka one 114 Gall. cask remade it put  
new heads in it gaged 104 Gall<sup>ns</sup>.
