

Remarks Monday 6th Dec: 1841
Commences with fine weather and light
breezes Middle part calm, broke out
in the main hatch for meat and
Water the water being bad pumped
but little, broacha beef & Pork
Latter part Strong breezes attended
with Thunder Lighting and heavy rain

Tuesday 7th Latitude 23. 24. N

Weather still Cloudy, breeze more
Moderate, from the Northward at 7 a.m.
broke out in the Fore Hatch for Water
took up two Empty cask put down
beef & Pork from the main hatch
Latter part light breezes and Cloudy

Wednesday 8th No Obs.

Commences with light breezes and
Cloudy weather Middle and latter
part Cloudy, Wind variable and Squally
at 11 a.m. Carried away Flying Jib boom

Thursday 9th Lat, 21. 13. N

This day Commences with Strong
breezes from East, Course South Middle
and Latter part as above Lat 18. 13. N
Long 26. 47. W.

Remarks Friday 10th Dec: 1841
This day Commences with favourable
weather Course south wind East
Middle part fresh gales at 9 a.m. saw
a sail off the le bow Standing to the
Southward Latter part Moderate and
hazy, Latitude at noon 18. 24. N

Saturday 11th Longitude 25. 56. W

This day Commences with Strong gales
at East course South at 2 P. M. saw
a sail off the Weather ^{bow} Standing to
the Northward. Middle part light wind
and variable at daylight three sail in
sight one to windward one to leeward
and one Astern of us, she came up with
us and spoke, it was H. B. M. Brig Lynne
from Brava the Evening previous

Latitude at noon 13. 34

Sunday 12th Longitude 25. 23.

Fine pleasant weather wind East
Portably all drawing, sail set
Middle and Latter part fine pleasant
weather and gentle breezes the sail
to leeward of us still in sight

Longitude 25. 07. W.
