

Remarks Monday 17th June 1844
Strong breeze and thick weather saw a ship
pass to leeward of us Lat at noon 31. 35 N.

Tuesday 18th
Moderate breeze and thick weather Lat 31. 53

Wednesday 19th
First part of this day thick fog. Latter more clear
Lat 31. 38 N.

Thursday 20th
Fine clear weather and light breeze Lat 31. 31 N.

Friday 21st
Light breeze and clear weather saw a Barque
to leeward of us, Lat 31. 29 N.

Saturday 22nd
Light breeze and clear weather, the Barque a little
to leeward of us. Lat 30. 59 N.

Sunday 23rd
Fine weather this day the Barque passed to windward
of us Lat at noon 30 20
Long of Lunor at 4. 30 P.M. 166 52 East.

Monday 24th
This morning saw the Barque take a Whale, we chased
all day no success fine moderate weather Lat 29. 28
Long of Lunor at 2 P.M. 167. 5 E.

Tuesday 25th
This morning a ship and Barque in sight, spoke
the ship Narragansett of Nantucket saw Whales lower
two boats no success. Lat at noon 28. 45 N.

Wednesday 26th
This day moderate weather saw two ships, one
to windward one to leeward of us Lat at noon 28 47 N.

Thursday 27th
This morning saw a ship to leeward of us chasing
Whales at 10 o'clock we lowered the whale boat took
a 30 lb. whale Lat at noon 29. 03.

Friday 28th
This morning cutting the whale saw a ship off the
weather quarter, to windward for Whales. The whale boat
took one Lat at noon 29 08

Saturday 29th
This morning finished boiling and cut in the other whale

Sunday 30th
This day finished boiling both Whales made about 60 bls.

Remarks Monday 1st July 1844
This day Coopered 20 Ribs for Steady, Lat 29. 25 N.

Tuesday 2nd
This day spoke down about 60 bls. in the afternoon
Strong breeze and a heavy swell,

Wednesday 3rd
Light air and cloudy heading East,

Thursday 4th
Thick haze weather and some rain, saw a sail
to leeward of us.

Friday 5th
Fine moderate weather spoke the ship Ann Alexander
100 bls this season. Lat at noon 29. 55 N.

Saturday 6th
Fine weather this day saw three sail headed East
Lat at noon 29. 59 N.

Sunday 7th
Long of Lunor at 9 o'clock 167. 13. East
Fine gentle breeze this day saw a ship pass to windward
of us called her the Cortez Lat at noon 29. 56 N.

Monday 8th
Long of Lunor at 9 o'clock 167. 58. 45 E.
This morning spoke the Foster 500 this season and the
Rockman 11 months out 260 bls.

Tuesday 9th
This morning saw a ship to leeward of us at 9 o'clock
to wind for Whales the Starbora boat took one - at two
o'clock to wind again but no success. Lat at noon 29. 20

Wednesday 10th
This morning finished cutting and commenced
boiling at sun set spoke the ship Balance of
New Bedford 100 bls.

Thursday 11th
This day at noon finished boiling about 38 bls - saw a
ship ahead of us.

Friday 12th
Fine moderate weather this day saw two ships at 5 o'clock
saw Whales lower no success Lat at noon 29. 35
