

Remarks On board

Tuesday January 13<sup>th</sup> 1845

commences with light wind at 6 o'clock at 5 reefs for East at 7 took in sail at daylight light wind laid off the ship made all sail to East 1 sail in use

Wednesday January 14<sup>th</sup>

comm with a light breeze at Westward Ship Hope of Providence Master 45 this sail bound to N West at daylight set all crew wind N by East at 8 wind cut to steering by East 1 sail in use weather dark

Long by " 166 00

Thursday January 15<sup>th</sup>

strong breezes at East coast covered 5 o'clock at 6 o'clock saw large sperm whales at run down landed the boats the Starboard boat struck and parted took in life sails at 10 hauled at 1 hauled at 4 hauled again at daylight saw sulphur bottoms strong breezes with rain at 11 took in Mizzen topsails double reefed fore and main parted main sail at 11 run off 5 o'clock West with a gale from the N East

Ship Noctezuma

Friday January 15<sup>th</sup> 1846

commences with a gale from the East N East at 1 o'clock took in fore topsail and fore sail gib 30 at 7 Moderates at daylight thick fog at 8 made sail strong breezes steering W by West

Saturday January 17<sup>th</sup>

commences with light wind at 3 o'clock N by West at 7 took in gib Main sail at daylight made sail rainy covered N East at 10 saw heavy under all sail

Sunday January 18<sup>th</sup>

commences with light pleasant weather wind S by East covered East at 7 took in life sails hauled 400 aback heading N by N at the at daylight saw sperm whales landed boats took 5 to the ship lost one 1 sunk 1 hauled up could not find him one was lost from along side dump fluke chain also all care left less piece off bursage cut in fore
