Friday the 1st (1830) (Sept. 3 rd)	This 24 hours commenced with gentle gales from the N th & N ^W & freshened a noon and put the sea strong winds all the 24 hours all hands em- ployed in stowing chains away so ends this 24 hours
Satter the 2 nd	This 24 hours commenced with gentle gales and the lazy weather latter part clear and gentle gales from S & S ^W all hands em- ployed in getting the boats so ends this 24 hours -
Sunday	This 24 hours light winds and calms all hands employed in picking over potatoes all the middle part gentle breezes from S ^W & S ^W & S ^W the latter part light winds & calms so ends this 24 hours Latitude 41° 48'
Monday Septem the 6 th Day	These 24 hours commenced with light breezes from the S ^W & S ^W & S ^W & S ^W saw a brig standing to the south at 9 pm tacked and stood to the S ^W & S ^W all the middle part gentle gales from S ^W & S ^W the latter part moderate so ends the 24 hours Latitude by observation
Tuesday the 7 th Day Septem	This 24 hours begins with moderate winds from S ^W & S ^W & S ^W & S ^W all hands employed in ships duty at 3 pm saw a bark ship & steam engine at 4 pm all the middle part thick driving weather the at 10 am spoke a brig bound to west on all the latter part moderate hands em- ployed in ships duty so ends this 24 hours
